GOD LOVE YOU!

IT IS TOO SIMPLE a statement to say that Our Lord was poor. Because He said: "Foxes have holes, and the birds of the air their nests, but the Son of Man has nowhere to lay His head"; we are apt to think that Our Lord was poor like millions of people in our Mission lands. Such is not the case. The refugees from Communism, in Korea, Vietnam, the lepers in Africa were born poor but Our Lord "became poor", which is quite a different thing. St. Paul tells us: "He impoverished Himself for your sakes, when He was so rich, so that you might become rich through His poverty." From the height of the incomparable riches of Divinity He descends to the depths of poverty, want and emptiness as the Son of Man.

The universe was His, because He made it; and yet He claimed nothing in it. The point is then that He wants us to exchange our material riches for spiritual riches. Our fullness comes from His emptiness and our emptiness from His fullness. His riches of the spiritual. Any gift He has for us depends on the fact that He became poor. Now He wants us to do what He did, namely, to take any superfluity that we have and to "become a little poorer" for His sake, thus receiving in return His spiritual wealth of grace.

Because the Society for the Propagation of the Faith belongs to the Vicar of Christ we may beg on in the way Christ would have us beg. We do not want you to give something; we want you to exchange something — your impoverishment through a sacrifice for your enrichment through an increase of grace of Christ. Develop the spirit of detachment daily by becoming poor in some little way: deny yourself dessert or cigarettes. Then send us your sacrifice which will go to the Holy Father for the Mission poor who will be your brothers and sisters in the kingdom of heaven. Actually we are doing you a favor by telling you this Divine truth, but we are grateful not just for your gift but for your becoming more closely united to Our Lord and His Blessed Mother, the Holy Father and the Missions of the Church.
