

Doyle, Trustee Rites Conducted

Funeral services for J. Doyle, for 41 years trustee of the Assumption, Fairport, were held at 10:30 a. m. at the Assumption church on Monday, Dec. 31.

Mr. Doyle, 71, who was named outstanding Catholic layman of 1956 by the Catholic War Veterans of Monroe County, died Dec. 29, 1956 in St. Mary's Hospital after a long illness.

Solemn Mass of Requiem was offered by the Rev. Leonard A. Kelly, pastor assisted by the Rev. Anthony F. Callmeri, Deacon and the Rev. James P. Wood, subdeacon. Also in attendance were the Reverend Fathers James Embser, C.S.B. and Willfred Dwyer, C.S.B.

HIS EXCELLENCY, Auxiliary Bishop Lawrence S. Casey imparted the final absolution.

Bearers were Vincent J. Lawler, Tyler Cobb, Dean L. Taylor, Melvin McMahon, Glen Gazley, and Gerald Flanagan.

A native of Fairport, Mr. Doyle retired in 1930 after 40 years with the American Can Co. starting in the manufacturing division of its predecessor, the Sanitary Can Co. of Fairport, in 1904. In 1919 he was transferred from the Fairport plant to the sales Division in Rochester.

Mr. Doyle was appointed by then Governor Franklin D. Roosevelt in 1930 to the new Genesee State Park Commission, which had jurisdiction over Letchworth Park and later Hamlin Beach Park. He served 14 years on the seven-man board. He was a highly respected and active member of the Democratic party.

Active in the affairs of his parish, he cooperated recently in the establishment of the new School of Religion and Convent of the Sisters, Mission Helpers of the Sacred Heart now in operation in Fairport.

He is survived by his wife, Louise S.; one daughter, Margaret L. (Peggy) Doyle of the Times-Union society staff; a son, Jerome E. Doyle of Rochester; two brothers, George B. of Buffalo and James B. Doyle of Simcoe, Ont. and four sisters, Mrs. William E. Menard, the Misses Ann and Katherine Doyle, all of Buffalo and Mrs. Bernard B. Foster of Pompano Beach, Fla. and Detroit; three grandchildren, several nieces and nephews.

At the interment in St. Mary Cemetery, Fairport, Father Kelly assisted the Rev. Richard A. Hart imparted the final blessing.

Indian Mission Need Cited, Aid Asked By League
"Two infants died from exposure," reports John Glevanik, a Marquette League Lay Apostle stationed at Manderson, a small Indian settlement in South Dakota's Pine Ridge Reservation. "And more tragedies can be expected," added Glevanik, "unless we get some warm clothing for the needy Indians here."

St. Agnes Church at Manderson is an outlying station of the main mission for the reservation. Father Peter O. Price, the missionary priest, with five other small stations to serve, is unable to visit more than twice a month.

JOHN GLEVANIK and his wife, two residents of San Diego, offered to live in the church rectory and look after some of the material needs of the Indian flock during the priest's absence. Besides infants' bed-clothing, children's shoes are needed.

In the same week Monsignor Bernard Cullen of the Marquette League (295 Fourth Ave., New York 10, N.Y.) received another SOS from St. Charles Indian Mission, another small mission in the brutally cold Northwest.

A forty-mile gale ripped part of the roof off the convent and of the school house during the pre-Christmas week. During the same storm, the mission car froze and the nearest telephone was forty-five miles away at Billings, Montana.

Monsignor Cullen asks help for both of these missions.
