Every new work of Father Raymond since THE MAN WHO GOT EVEN WITH GOD has had a big welcome, and this book of Cistercian women saints has been no exception. In fact, its merits must put it near the top of the list.

Here is vivid, popularized history like that in THREE RELIGIOUS REBELS, introduced by a comparison of the thirteenth century with our own so foursquare and compelling that we are left no choice but strenuous holiness to redeem the time as they did, to answer Iron Curtain tyranny with deliberate death to self.

There are fifteen personalities worth running into even so briefly, each like a banner bearing the legend, "You will never live until you have lost your life; you will never love until you have given your heart away; you will never walk aright unless you walk with God."

THESE SAINTS are from the Low Countries and the high from Flanders from the land of the Cid, from Guelph and Ghibelline Italy, from Poland, Germany, France.

There is even a little family of Moslem martyrs. Their names are fearsome some of them: Lutgarde, Asceline, Aleyde, Franca, Sancha, Mafalda, Mechthilde. It is a relief to note a new Mary and Grace and Teresa, a familiar Gertrude and Hedwig and Ida.

Yet the names leave a sweet taste in the heart when their modest pages have been turned — and Mechthilde, the darling.

Rome — (NC) — The shooting of the first scenes of a movie based on the life of St. Ignatius of Loyola will soon begin here. The role of St. Ignatius will be played by the American actor, Jose Ferrer. The movie, an American-Spanish production, will be filmed partly in Italy and partly in Spain. Mr. Ferrer is also directing the picture, with a Jesuit priest acting as adviser.

Congressman Keating Puts Pope's Talk In 'Record'

Washington — (NC) — At the request of Rep. Kenneth B. Keating of Rochester, N. Y., excerpts from the Christmas message of His Holiness Pope Pius XII were inserted in the Congressional Record.

In asking that the excerpts be published, Mr. Keating said: "In his message, His Holiness appealed to all the free nations to resist the threats and pressures of the Soviet Union. It was certainly his strongest attack ever on the rulers of the Kremlin; surely it was also one of his finest addresses."

Georgetown Law School Names Woman Professor

Washington — (NC) — Georgetown's University 87-year-old law center will acquire its first woman professor February 1 when Helen E. Steinbinder takes up her post as professor of real property. It has been announced.

THE 31-YEAR-OLD professor has been teaching on a part-time basis at the law center since last September, giving lectures in "Real Property II."

A native of New York City, Prof. Steinbinder was graduated from Manhattanville College of the Sacred Heart, Purchase, N. Y., in 1944.

SHE EARNED two masters degrees in history and in library science, from Columbia University in 1949 and 1950, and her bachelor and master of laws degrees from Georgetown in 1953 and 1956.

She previously taught in New York City high schools. She was the first woman student admitted to the Georgetown law center. This year there are 28 women enrolled, in a total registration of 1,125.

Basketball Star Son Of Former Vatican Guard

Worcester, Mass. — (NC) — Trading of basketball star Togo Palazzi by the Boston Celtics to the Syracuse Nationals served to recall that he is the son of a former Vatican guard, 10-inch member of the Vatican Guards. The star was born in Union City, N. J., after his father emigrated to this country.

He was an All-American basketball player at Holy Cross College before joining the Celtics of the National Basketball League three years ago. He now makes his home here.

Palazzi was dropped by the Celtics to make room for Bill Russell, giant All-American from San Francisco University and star of the recent Olympic games in Australia.

The Syracuse Nats will play the Rochester Royals at Community War Memorial on Saturday, Jan. 12.

British Catholics Map School Building Program

London — (RNS) — Britain's Roman Catholics will spend more than \$19,600,000 on new schools during the 1956-57 school year, according to Bishop George Andrew Beck of Brentwood, chairman of the Catholic Education Council.

Writing in the Universe, Catholic weekly published here, he said it will cost more the \$350,000,000 to erect all the schools that Catholic authorities have planned for the future.

Under the 1944 Education Act, new denominational schools have to be built and opened before any financial aid is given by the government. Meanwhile, the churches must pay half the cost of bringing existing schools up to prescribed standards or else have them taken over by the State as controlled schools.

Bishop Brent said the enrollment in Catholic State-aided special agreement schools has increased from 350,394 in 1947 to 473,811 in 1956.

More Church Schools Urged By State's Leading Paper

Manchester, N.H. — (NC) — The Manchester Union-Leader, New Hampshire's largest daily newspaper, has advocated the establishment of more church-supported schools.

"Today," the newspaper said, "almost the only refuge for those who would have their children enjoy a godly and christian upbringing are the parochial schools of the Catholic Church and the schools of the Lutheran Church. Other denominations have a few schools but not many."

Russians Slaughtered 270 Hungarians In Breadline

Springfield, Ill. — (NC) — Janos Tury, one of 20 Hungarian refugees who arrived here, reported he saw Russian soldiers mow down with machine guns some 270 men, women and children standing in a Budapest breadline.

He said about 600 were in the breadline and that nearly half of them were killed.

Mr. Tury also said he also saw Hungarian women and children loaded into box cars by Russians for deportation. He said most of those selected were from breadlines.

Accompanying Mr. Tury to this country were his wife and their two children, aged 4 and 3.

The refugees came to Springfield under the auspices of the diocese's Catholic Charities with the assistance of Catholic Relief Services-National Catholic Welfare Conference.

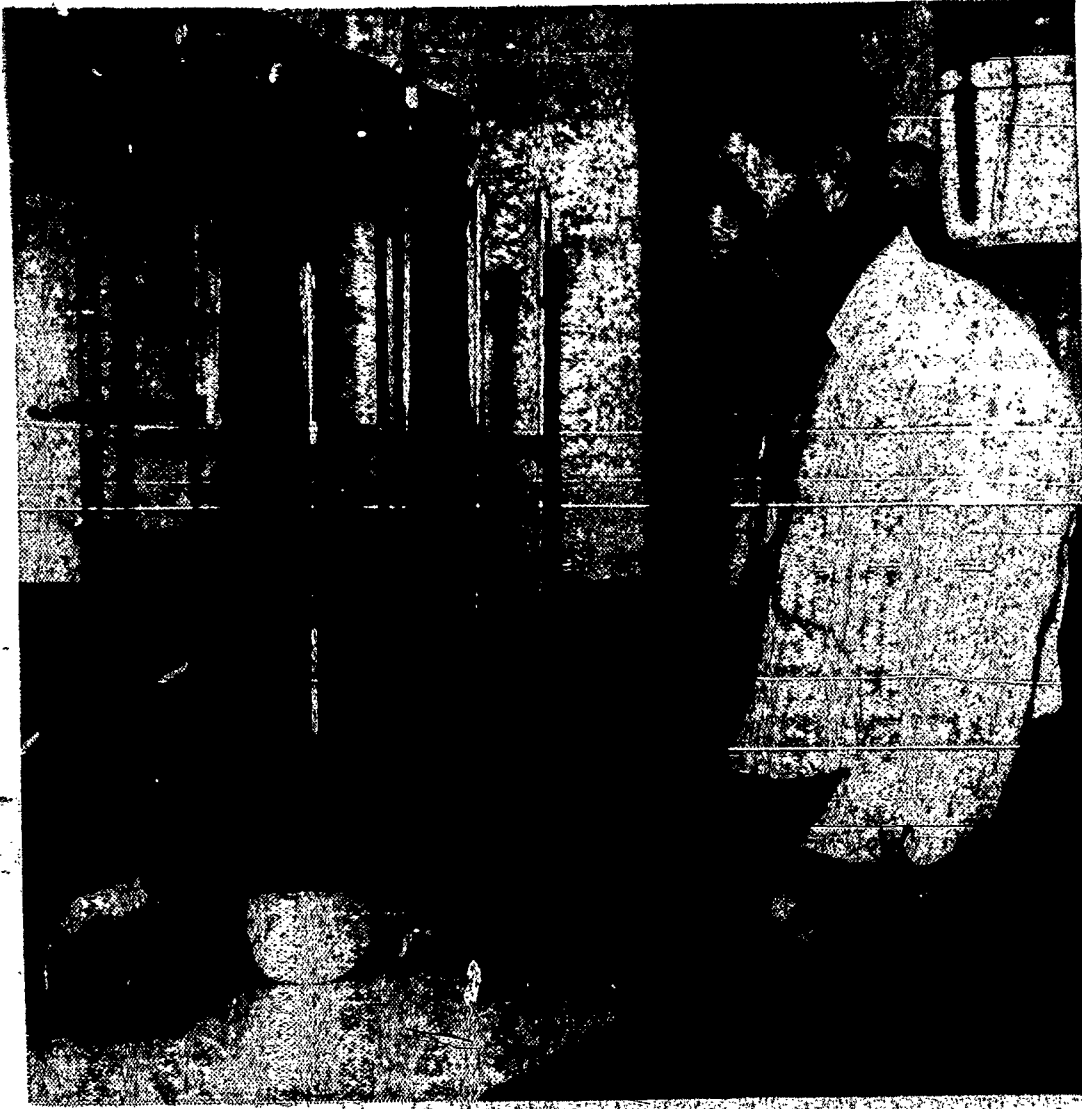
