Requiem Mass Conducted For James M. Ryan

Geneva — Funeral services for James M. Ryan, 64, of 124 William St., prominent local attorney and senior member of the Geneva Board of Education, were held Monday from the family home and in St. Stephen Church. Interment was in St. Patrick Cemetery. Mr. Ryan, who has practiced here as an attorney since 1921, died Thursday, Jan. 3, 1957 in Geneva General Hospital, after suffering a heart attack earlier.

Born Aug. 18, 1892, in Port Byron, the son of James M. Ryan and Ellen E. Ryan, the Geneva attorney graduated from Syracuse University. He received his law degree from Albany Law School in 1920 and was admitted to the bar the following year. He was married June 22, 1926, to Elizabeth King of this city. Mr. Ryan, at the time of his death, was serving as vice president of the Board of Education, a trustee of the Geneva Savings Bank of Geneva, vice president of the Ontario Sand and Gravel Co., and as a member of the Advisory Board of Radio Station WGVA. He was a member of the Rotary Club and past president of the club. He also held membership in the Geneva Rod and Gun Club and the Holy Name Society of St. Stephen Church to which he belonged. He was a member of the State Bar Association and served on the executive committee of the group; a member and past president of the Ontario County Bar Association and a member of the American Bar Association. Besides his widow, Mr. Ryan is survived by a daughter, Mrs. Frances Furst of Baltimore, Md.; three sisters, Mrs. William A. McDonald, Auburn; Mrs. Charles Nellis, Amsterdam, and Mrs. Joseph Conroy, Rochester; a grandson and several nieces and nephews.
