Mrs. Robert P. Lewis and Mrs. Robert Connors were named co-chairmen of the volunteer recruitment program now under way.

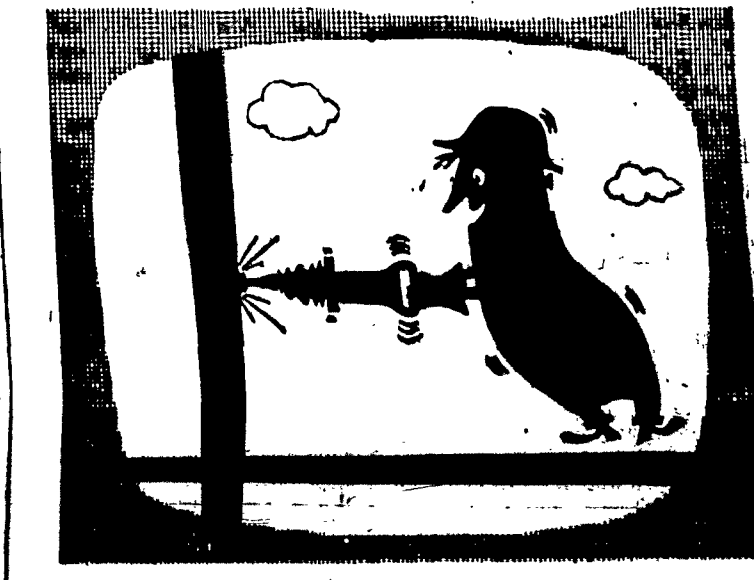
