### **Drought From Democracy**

Bone dry and blowing away, millions of acres of soil the Great Plains states of the southwest are pulverized the worst drought conditions in that area's history.

Political erlows in Poland. Hungary, Egypt, England and the Middle East have tumbled over one another consimilar our attention while the hand we live on blows out the back door.

In a dusty, whirlwind three-day tour of six states, the President viewed the devastation first hand — and when March winds berin to blow 80 million more acres of farm soft will be blown away or swept into the muddy Mississippi and Gulf of Mexico.

Like the Hungarians who fled to us seeking protection from Soviet tyrants - our own Americans in the southwest facing a similar blasting of their lifelong labors to build security are in urrent need of national aid.

Mr. Eisenhower promised immediate aid would be given. Ultimate solution of the drought problem, as we see it. depends not ad much on decisions made in Washington but on two factors—one within our control and one beyond

First of all, the Great Plains need - and need urgently -sither heavy winter snows or early drenching spring rains, and that decision awaits the mercy of God.

The second factor takes the problem right back to the green cheeks?" location where it started - the "big operators" who have constantly and willfully exploited the land for the profit of a "fast buck." For twenty mers, southwestern farm manipulators have been told that misuse of the land would spell their ultimate dooms. Now their chickens of greed have comic home to roost and we are expected to step in with govermment aid to apprort those who squandered our nation's heritage.

If we have to pay compulsory taxes, it seems equally fair that the southwest should face up to compulsory conservation of our national resources. To a great extent, the southwest's drought is the result of too much democracy. It is time that a long-range plan be developed to prevent continued misuse of our own, my native land.

Candles used at Catholic ceremonies will be blessed in annual rites in parish churches tornorrow (Satzurday, Feb. 2), feast of the Puzification of our

Most parishes will conduct the blessing rite tomorrow before the first morning Mass. Except for the Sacrament of Penance (Confession), all the other six Sacraments are ordinarily administered by candlelight.

TISE OF CANDLES in church rites can be traced back to Apostolic times. Descriptions of third century Easter vigil rites, recently restored to its original midnight observance, tell how "night was transformed into day.

St. Jerome, fourth century Biblical scholar, declared that candles were lighted when the Gospel was read at Mass, not because light was needed to read by, but as a sign of joy.

Baptismal ceremonies dating from first centuries of Church history have included bestowal of a candile, a rite preserved even todav.

Symbolism of the candle recalls Christ, "the true light who enlightens every man coming into this world." Christ called Himself "the Light of the world."

The number of candles used at a ceremony often indicates the soleminity of the feast or rank of the celebrant. Thus seven candles are lighted at the altar for a bishop's high Mass, four for his low Mass.

Six candles are used at priest's high Mass, two for a low Mass. On occasions of special festivity more candlesare usually lighted. It is forbidden to say Mass without candles and if there is danger of their being blown out, they should be protected by lanters.

In the early Mickele Ages, about the eleventh century, the Church developed time present rite of blessing canciles to be used at religious services.

THE FEBRUARY 2nd date was chosen as most appropriate because that date, 40 days after Christmas, marks the day when Simeon declared the Christ Child to be "a light to enlighten the Gentiles."

The feast is called the "purification" of the Blessed Virgin because Jewish law excluded a new mother from. the Temple until forty days after the birth of Ener child. At the end of the forty day period, she was required to present the child to the priest and offer a sacriffice - a lamb or two pigeons. Following this rite, the mother would be declared "purified" and admitted to the Temple






