

11 To Be Ordained For Syracuse Diocese

All graduates of St. Andrew and St. Bernard seminaries, Rochester, eleven young men will receive the Sacrament of Holy Orders from the hands of Bishop Walter A. Foery, Bishop of Syracuse for that diocese in the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception, Saturday, Feb. 2.

GOD LOVE YOU!

THE GOSPEL OF MATTHEW put our Lord's words first (the Sermon on the Mount) then His works of miracles. The nine miracles which are recounted are divided into three groups of three each. The first group is concerned with bodily healing and show our Lord as the Divine Physician healing three types of diseases: leprosy, palsy and fever. These three stand for three diseases of the moral order, the first, leprosy, under Old Testament legislation being the symbol of sin. The leper said to our Lord "Lord if it be Thy Will Thou hast power to make me clean. The leper was sure of the power-but not of the willingness of the Divine Master. The leper while clinging to the hope that our Lord will heal him, is resigned to being left in his sad condition. Our Lord moved with compassion put forth His hand and touched him. The poor leper had almost forgotten that in all the world there was such a thing as a kindly hand and he was cured.

There are between four million and twelve million lepers in the world today. In our Missions we have 1,200 priests, brothers and sisters caring for about 300,000 lepers in 300 leproseries. Many of these people are as clean on the inside as they are diseased on the outside. Just as many in our civilization are as clean on the outside as they are diseased on the inside. Leprosy is a symbol of sin, but the leper is not necessarily the sinner. He portrays in his flesh the foulness of sin in the soul.

Every person who has ever sinned — and who of us have not at least to some extent — should make recompense for the loss of grace in the soul by restoring health to the bodies of lepers. If 200 of our priests, brothers and sisters have contracted the disease in sacrificing their lives for lepers; cannot we sacrifice something we own, that God in His mercy may heal our leprosy of soul?

Divine Word Missionary To Mark Golden Jubilee

Conesus — Father Augustine Loechte, S.V.D., a member of the seminary faculty at St. Michael's Mission Seminary, Conesus, will observe the golden jubilee of his ordination on Monday, Feb. 11. He will offer Solemn High Mass at 9 a.m., assisted by Father Edmund Morman, S.V.D., as deacon and Father Wilbur J. Klunk, S.V.D., as subdeacon.

The jubilee sermon will be preached by the Very Rev. Robert J. Studeny, S.V.D., Rector of Sacred Mission Seminary, Girard, Pa. Dinner for the local clergy and friends will be served at 12 noon.

FATHER LOECHTE was born in Recke, Westphalia, Germany in 1880. He entered the Seminary of the Divine Word Missionaries in Steyl, Holland at the age of 15 and admitted by the holy Founder of the new Mission Order, Father Arnold Janssen. Having completed his Preparatory Seminary training, he continued his studies at St. Gabriel's Mission Seminary in Vienna, Austria. There he was ordained to the holy priesthood on Feb. 10, 1907 with a class of 40 of which 14 are still living and doing mission work in Japan, New Guinea, China and Germany.

Although the jubilarian had hoped to be missioned to Japan, the Superior General, Father Arnold Janssen, believed that he could do more effective work in the first American Seminary of the Divine Word Missionaries in Techny, Illinois.

THREE MONTHS after his ordination, in May 1907, Father Loechte arrived in the United States and has been on the seminary faculty all these years, except for two years spent in Rome and the Holy Land in pursuit of advanced studies.

Father Loechte held high offices in the Society, being Rector of St. Mary's Mission Seminary, Techny, Ill., and St. Francis Xavier Mission Seminary, Island Creek, Mass. His deep spirituality, it is said, has prompted him as spiritual director of the Brothers, Prefect of the Seminary and regular confessor to the various departments. Today at 76, Father Loechte still continues a heavy schedule, teaching Sacred Scripture, Patrology, History and Lives of the Saints. Besides this, he still renders invaluable clerical assistance every Sunday to St. Thomas Church, Leicester and the neighboring missions of Piffard and Retsof.

Former Genevan To Teach At ND

Poet Robert Fitzgerald, who was born in Geneva, N. Y., will teach at the University of Notre Dame during the spring semester beginning Jan. 30 according to the Rev. Philip S. Moore, C.S.C., vice president for academic affairs.

Fitzgerald, who has received critical acclaim for his translations of the classics as well as for his poems, will teach a graduate course in "literary theory" and an undergraduate course in "Seventeenth Century English Poetry."

Since 1953, Fitzgerald and his family have lived in Italy where he began a verse translation of the Odyssey on a Guggenheim Fellowship during 1953-54. Raised in Springfield, Ill., Fitzgerald was educated at Harvard University and Trinity College, Cambridge. He worked briefly as a reporter for the New York Herald Tribune and for several years before and after World War II he was a writer and editor for TIME. During the war he served as a Navy officer at Pearl Harbor and on Guam.
