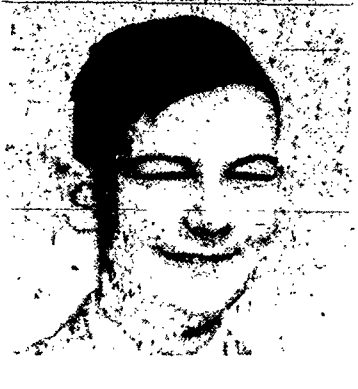


### Leaders of Auburn KC Auxiliary
