

## Mayor Lambert To Open Holy Ghost Convent Drive

The Mayor, James G. Lambert, pastor of St. Mary's Church, will address more than 100 men of Holy Ghost Convent at a committee rally at 5 p.m. Tuesday, Feb. 5, in the school building.

The new convent, already under construction, will replace the present inadequate frame structure now housing the school. The new building will be used for the school and convent. The old building will be razed to provide additional parking area.

The Rev. Albert J. Gieger, pastor, announced that the committee will have its campaign kickoff dinner at 7 p.m. on Saturday, Feb. 9, in the parish hall. His Excellency Auxiliary Bishop Lawrence B. Casey will be principal speaker.

Designed for a capacity of 10 Sisters, the proposed convent will include a chapel, community room, two reception rooms, kitchen and laundry. The present building is more than a half-century old.
