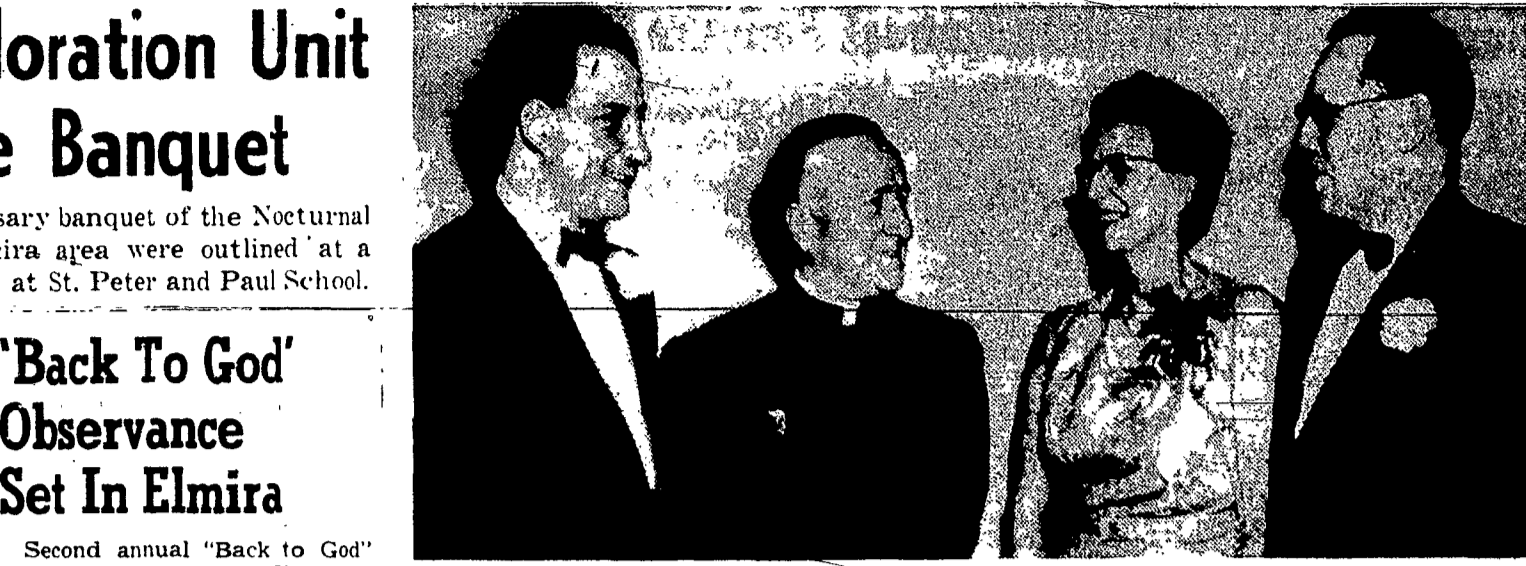

Wydler's Milford Voorhees told inquirers to "book early."

Victor DePrez stated that the clerks at his Powers Hotel Lobby office have been "giving out folders to people who phoned or wrote in asking information."

DePrez said that "immediate reservation is imperative because the pilgrimage group will be limited to about 35 people."

At Kalbfleisch agency, William Mullaney reported, "inquiries are beyond our expectations." He warned that late requests for reservations will have to be turned down — or face having to fly to Europe and meet the group there instead of taking the boat trip.

Highlight of the 48-day pilgrimage will be an audience with the Holy Father.
