## Jazz Expert Slated For College

Bary Ulanov, internationally famous jazz critic and historian, will speak at Nazareth College on Wednesday, Feb. 13 at 2 p.m. as part of the college lecture series.

Called "one of the most exciting and stimulating of the younger generation of Catholic apologists," Dr. Ulanov was born in New York City of Russian parents. He received his Ph.D. from Columbia University.

A columnist for "Down Beat," a magazine which he once edited, Dr. Ulanov is the prefect and cofounder of New York's Sodality of Our Lady of the Cross, a spiritual organization of professional men and women.

FOR THE PAST four years he has been on the English faculty of Barnard College and has also given courses at the Juilliard School of Music, Princeton University, New York's Newman Institute and Marywood College.

Dr. Ulanov's published writing includes a lecture on "The Recorded Music of Mozart: An Essay on 'The Ephemeral Melodine'" for a symposium on the "The Last Essays of Georges Bernanos."

He is most widely known through American, South American, English and Italian editions of his books on music in the modern idiom: "Duke Ellington," "The Incredible Croaky" and "A History of Jazz in America."

IN HIS LECTURE at Nazareth, "Catholicism at Home and Abroad," Dr. Ulanov will deal with the achievements and the failures, the spiritual values and the apostolic genius of Catholics in the United States and Europe. The public is invited.
