Catholic Nursing Schools Cite Gains St. Louis, Mo. — (RNS) — The 322 Catholic Schools of Nursing in the United States are turning out one-third of all the graduate registered nurses in the nation.

This report was given here by Margaret Foley, secretary of the Conference of Catholic Schools of Nursing.

"While I cannot substantiate it," she said, "I do not believe any other phase of Catholic education, including the medical and legal, accounts for that high a percentage of graduates."

Miss Foley noted that the number of fully-accredited Catholic nursing schools had increased from 91 to 121 last year, a 33 per cent gain.

But total admissions to Catholic schools of nursing decreased 1.8 per cent in 1956, she said. And the acute shortage of nurses continues in some sections of the country, the secretary added.
