Father Hogan presented by Mrs. Mary A. Crandall, grand regent, spoke on "Formula for Personal Happiness." This formula is personal sanctity, he said. "The one success in life is our own personal holiness," Doctor Hogan said. "This is the age of selfishness. Persons who are forever talking have no time to think and to discover themselves.
