consl. I have followed Dr. White's career as a teacher and writer for many years and so I was particularly interested in reading a précis of her remarks. Mrs. Strohmeier reports: "In the words of Dr. White two things are very important if the Catholic woman is to take her part in the civic life of today. First, she should possess as much as she can of the riches of her tradition, remembering what St. John of the Cross once said, "God is a well from which every one may draw water according to the measure of his vessel."

"SECOND, THE Catholic woman should know as much as possible of the world in which she is trying to work. The Catholic woman should have, as broad and as accurate a picture as possible of the world in which she is living, and she should approach that world prepared to find, often under strange appearance, unexpected sympathies.

"She should never forget that many people who have quite different backgrounds from hers will be ready to appreciate the value she brings if she can reveal them in her association with these people rather than just by talking about those values. And she should never forget how little our friends outside the Church know about its inner realities."

And in conclusion she states, "Even though we have spread out sails for eternity we should never cease trying to exert every effort to cast the light which is ours on the shadows of the present."
