That is why I say we cannot look for alasting peace through the conquest of Russla, if that were possible. The only hope for peace-and indeed, the only hope for the survival of civilization—seems to lie in a change within Russia herself that will remove her as a threat to the rest of the world.

These are the conclusions forced upon us as we survey the world situation today. They confirm belatedly what Our Lady predicted at Fatima almost forty years ago. May it not be too late still to obtain that peace she promised the world through the amendment of its ways and the recitation of Her Rosary.






