Plans for construction of a parochial school to serve the growing numbers of children in the Rush-Henrietta area were announced today by the Rev. George C. Vogt, pastor of Good Shepherd Church, Henrietta, and St. Joseph Church, Rush.

Completion of the school, to be erected on the seven-acre Good Shepherd Church plot on East Henrietta Road, is scheduled for September, 1958.

In a message to parishioners of both churches, Father Vogt pointed out that there are now more than 470 Catholic children attending public schools who are receiving time-limited religious instruction in both parishes.

PLEDGES TOWARD construction of the proposed school will be sought in a campaign to be conducted among Henrietta and Rush parishioners during a two-hour period Sunday, April 7. Organization of a committee of 300 men was underway this week under the direction of Foley Associates Inc., a Rochester fund-raising firm.

History of Catholicism in the area dates back to the Civil War year of 1864 when St. Joseph Church in Rush was dedicated by the then Bishop, Francis of the Buffalo Diocese. First a mission of Scottville, it later became a mission of Avon and then of Honeoye Falls, and finally of Good Shepherd Church, Henrietta.

The Rev. (now Rt. Rev. Msgr.) Thomas E. Connors, founder and present pastor of Blessed Sacrament Church, Rochester, founded Good Shepherd Church in 1911. Pastors of the Henrietta parish have included the Rev. Cornelius Silke (1916-18), the Rev. Victor J. Hurley (1919-30) and the late Rev. Raymond Lynch (1939-46). Father Vogt was appointed to succeed Father Lynch on Oct. 30, 1946. The Rev. Robert J. Miller is assistant pastor.

Eight Sunday Masses now are being celebrated in the 90-square-mile parish, including five at Good Shepherd Church, two at St. Joseph Church and one at St. Blaise Chapel in the Genesee Valley Community Hall, Riverview Drive, West Henrietta.
