DeSales High Asks Release Of Red-Held Prisoners

Geneva — The Catholic Students Mission Crusade of De Sales High School mailed over 200 airmail letters this week to Chairman Mao Tse-Tung, head of Red China's Government, petitioning the release of 10 Americans, who are still being held prisoners by the Chinese Reds.

BETSY LYNCH, a senior mission representative, and Thomas Toole, secretary of the mission unit directed this letter-writing campaign. John O'Connor, an active member of the C.S.M.C., is in charge of promoting this same crusade in St. Francis de Sales and St. Stephen parishes.

The Freedom Crusade was launched by the Rev. Harold Rigney, a Divine Word Missionary and author of the book "Four Years in a Red Hell." Father Rigney's own 10 year prison sentence in Red China was cut down to four years, two months as a result of similar letter-writing campaigns, students were told.
