J. R. Hostenstein Rites Conducted

Joseph R. Hostenstein, retired member of the Rochester Police Department and for fifty years a parishioner of St. Monica's Church, died suddenly February 22, 1957. He was 72 years old. Mr. Hostenstein was survived by two daughters, Sister Mary Leonard of Immaculate Conception Convent, Rochester, Mrs. Cecil Cunningham of Kenmore, New York, a son Robert J. also of Kenmore, and six grandchildren.

A member of the Police Department of Rochester for 48 years, he was honored at a testimonial dinner by police and friends following his retirement on May 1, 1954. He was affectionately known as the "unofficial police historian", because of his unusual ability to recall dates and incidents of police and civic history.

\$213,594 Total Pledged In St. Boniface Campaign
