Directed by Mrs. Robert J. Fulton, the play numbers a cast of 21 and a production staff of 22.

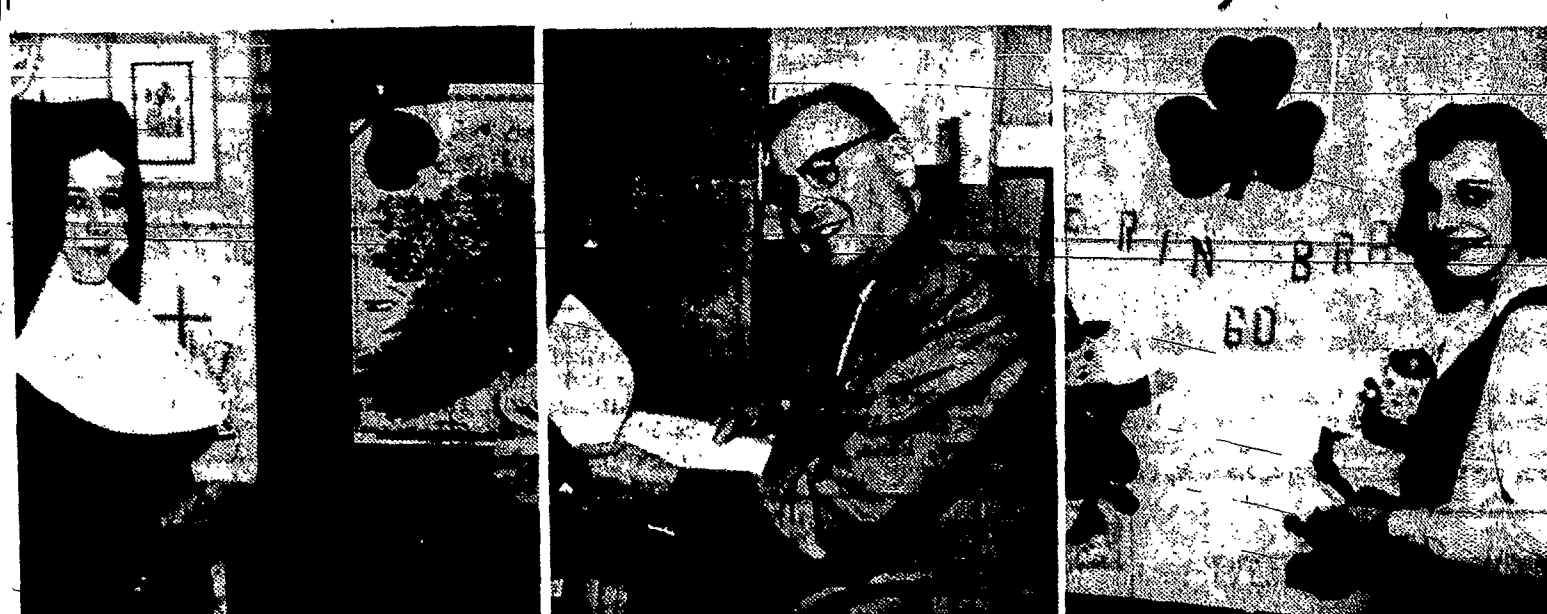
