

Pine Crest Manor In Second Year Of Service To Aged Of Corning Area

Corning — Pine Crest Manor, nursing home, included were 33 patients who were later discharged and seven transferred to other quarters. In all there were 5,287 "patient days" and 2,750 special diets prepared.

All types of aged patients were received, including those under care for cardiac, cerebral pneumonia, cancer, ulcers, diabetes, fractures and post-operative ailments. The nursing home, the only one in the area holding a permanent state license, is prepared to handle any medical and nursing care emergency and has or can readily obtain practically any type of medical equipment for the care of the aged patients.

THE ROOMS, located on two floors, has facilities for the care of 30 patients at one time. There is a registered nurse on duty at all times and in all there are six registered nurses, eight nursing aides, a cook, an orderly, cleaning woman and a dishwasher. Home style meals served on trays to all patients, provides a "home atmosphere."

Mrs. Sheedy, a 1939 graduate of the Corning Hospital School of Nursing and a former president of the Graduate Nurses' Association of this city, took over general supervision of Pine Crest Manor when it opened its doors just a year ago last Dec. 5 and since that has won the praise of many of the community's leading citizens for the manner in which she has directed the care of the aged of the community.

Mrs. Sheedy, a former member of the area Catholic Nurses group, is affiliated with the League of the Sacred Heart and the Catholic Action Society of St. Vincent's, and also of the Third Order of St. Francis.

ALL SIX registered nurses of the Pine Crest Manor staff are also Catholics. This, however, in no manner means that Pine Crest is open only to Catholic patients. It was opened a year ago in the former John Thomas home for the public of Corning, Painted Post and vicinity, and is one of four such licensed nursing homes under the general management of Gordon C. Oberlin of Oak Hill, N.Y.

The other three are Oak Hill Manor, 602 Hudson St., Bithwa; River View Rest Home, 358 Front St., Owego, and Lake Manor, 205 Lake Ave., Rochester.

During the first year of operation, according to Mrs. Sheedy's annual report, 68 patients moved in the 80-85 age bracket and a majority of them over 75 years, were given hospital care at the

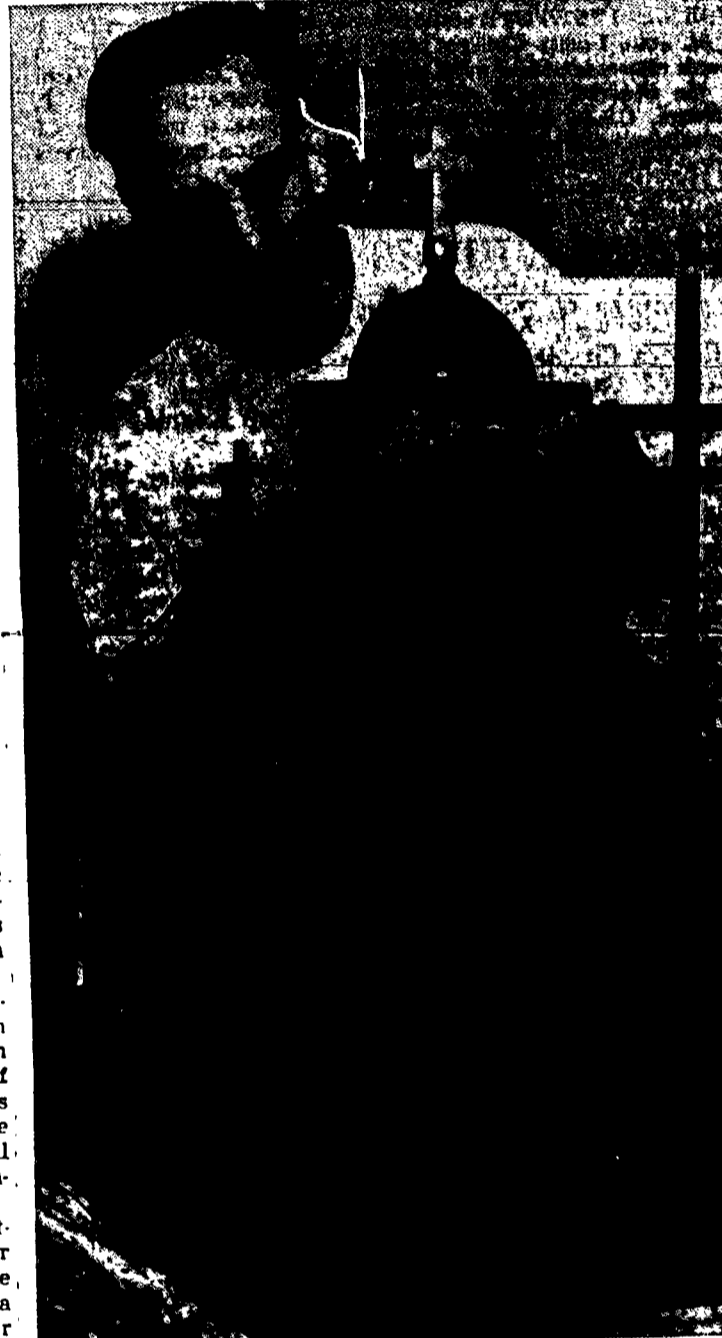
Church Replica Made By Rochesterian

Organ Music, Tolling Of Bells

Church Replica Made By Rochesterian

Memories of the church where he spent his boyhood in Italy have been brought to life by Jasper Civitello of 155 Avery St., Rochester, through intricate craftsmanship and long hours of work.

A miniature replica of St. Anne Church in Piedimonte Da Alife in the province of Caserta in Italy has been constructed by Civitello. More than a year and a half of his spare time was spent in the craftsmanship of the church.

Civitello, a carpenter by trade, spent long hours hand carving the intricate details of the church he left 50 years ago to come to America. Perfection was emphasized by the Holy Apostles parishioner, even to the finest details.

PRIDE IN HIS accomplishment was evident as he pointed out the various fine points of his work. Carved from wood, the miniature gives the appearance of a stone block church with a slate roof.

Details were highlighted even to a miniature pair of Rosary beads and a cord wasteband of a Franciscan monk in the bell tower. The iron railings at the church entrance, the massive carved doors and the stained glass windows all are reproduced with finest accuracy.

Civitello added a life like atmosphere to his model through the use of hand made mechanism controlled by switches. A flick of a switch and the church lights on. Another switch starts the Franciscan monk ringing the bell in the tower. A third switch controls the sound of organ music.

ANOTHER NOVEL effect utilized in the miniature is a pair of small holes in the front of the church. Behind each of these is a colored slide of the actual interior of St. Anne Church, one a full view of the altar and pews, and the other a close-up of the altar.

The miniature, measuring 28 inches long, 15 inches wide and 22 inches high was an answer to a dream Civitello long had of his boyhood church, the same church that the late Enrico Caruso used to attend many years ago.

Civitello stated that he would be happy to exhibit his handiwork for any societies, convents or groups that would be interested.

The ceremony closed with Benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament given by Rev. Michael Reder, O.F.M., assisted by Father McGhan, the Rev. Michael L. Hynes, Chaplain of the Dominican Monastery was present in the sanctuary.

The Class recited the Act of Consecration for Nurses during the services of Benediction.
