Msgr. Randall, CPA Head To Address HN

Monsignor John S. Randall who will speak at the annual meeting of Rochester Holy Name Deaneery Union, Sunday, March 24 in Immaculate Conception Parish Auditorium, Edinburgh St. is national president of the Catholic Press Association of the United States. The address will be given at the business session following Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament at 3 p.m. in Immaculate Conception Church of which Monsignor Randall is pastor. In his capacity as head of the Catholic Press in the United States, Monsignor Randall filed protests in behalf of the nation's 500 Catholic publications, representing a combined circulation of more than 22,000,000 against the White House invitation to Tito to visit the United States.

MANAGING EDITOR of the Catholic Courier Journal since October, 1942, Monsignor Randall was elected president of the CPA in Dallas, Texas in May, 1956. Active in the association since taking over the diocesan newspaper direction, he directed a Rochester convention of the newspaper editors in Rochester in 1950. He has been active in directing fund raising drives in the diocese, is chaplain of the Carmelite Monastery, chaplain of the Police Holy Name Society and holds other offices. In October, 1955, he directed the Mission Scenrama exhibition which drew more than 150,000 to the Rochester Community War Memorial.
