

Ithaca, Fairport Confraternity Classes Plan High School Forum At Assumption

"Don't follow the pattern — set it!" "What makes you, you?" "The use and abuse of free will" and other such topics will be discussed by the teenagers of immaculate Conception Confraternity classes, Ithaca, and Assumption Confraternity Classes, Fairport, at a fourth coming Forum.

Assumption School of Religion, Fairport, will be the scene of a high school forum on Sunday, March 31, from 1:30 to 4 p.m. Nancy Rinaldo, a Fairport senior, will open the Forum by giving a talk on "Personality."

Problems to be analyzed pertaining to this topic will be assigned to the various groups by Father Albert H. Schnacky, Diocesan Director of the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine.

The second topic in the agenda will be given by a senior of Ithaca High Richard Boronkay and is entitled "The Role of the Catholic Student in the Public High School."

WALTER ERBLAND, a Fairport senior will speak on "Man A Rational Being" and Ann Gilbert, senior of Ithaca High will give the concluding talk on "Catholic Leadership". Summarizer of the afternoon sessions will be William Murphy, a Fairport sophomore.

The students in the areas are taught by Fathers Richard A. Hart, William M. Thomas, Edward Zimmer and the Sisters, Mission Helpers of the Sacred Heart.

"Advanced Course for Catholic Living" is the Religion text being used at the centers and contains the material around which the forum is based. The four-year religion course is written by the Mission Helpers of the Sacred Heart.

At the conclusion of the afternoon sessions the board of Judges, Rev. William Roche, Assistant Superintendent of Schools in the Rochester diocese, Fathers Hart, Thomas and Zimmer, will select the best boy and girl discussion leader and present them with a prize.

Benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament will be offered by Rev. Leonard A. Kelly, at the climax of the Forum, followed by a social.

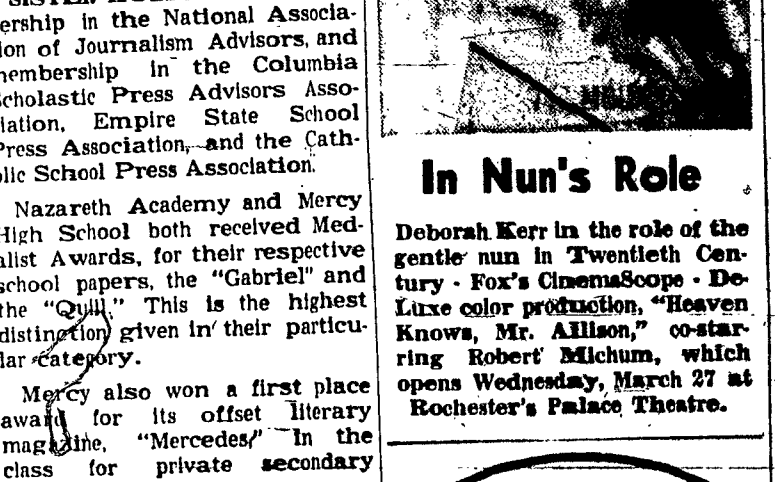
