### Former Labor Camp Inmate Receives Assistantship

A student at St. John Fisher College, Rochester, who once lived in a German labor camp, has received a teaching assistantship in the department of mathematics at St. John University Graduate School in Jamaica, N. Y.

James John Martyniak of 29 Warsaw St. Rochester, completed four years of schooling in his native Warsaw, Poland, before he and his family were taken to a labor camp in Lohr Main, Germany, following the invasion of Poland.

When they were liberated by American troops in 1945, the family was taken to a camp in Wetzlar, Germany where James completed grades 5, 6 and 7. The family later was released from the camp and lived privately while James completed the eighth grade and first year of high school.
