Chaplain Widman Promoted To Lt. Commander

Chaplain John A. Widman, priest of the Diocese of Rochester, has received word from the Secretary of the Navy of his promotion to the rank of lieutenant commander as of Feb. 1, 1957. It was announced this week.

FATHER WIDMAN was assistant pastor of St. Phillip Neri Church, Rochester, and after his ordination June 3, 1944 also served as assistant at St. Andrew Church, Rochester and St. Alphonsus Church, Auburn.

The new lieutenant commander was ordered to report to the battleship USS Iowa for the midshipmen's cruise on June 7. He will be detached from the Iowa on Aug. 7 and report to the USS Boston in Norfolk, Virginia about Aug. 27 for a normal tour of duty.

The Boston is a guided missile cruiser converted from a heavy cruiser in 1955 together with the USS Canberra.

Chaplain Widman's address as of about May 20 will be the USS Iowa (BB61) FPO New York, then as of August 7, USS Boston (CAG-1), FPO New York.

Prior to his appointment he was taking a course at the Menninger Foundation, Topeka, Kansas.

So, You've Been Elected Publicity Chairman

If you're like most people outside the publishing field, the first question you'll ask is, "How do I get news about my organization into the newspapers?" And, like most people, you'll raise a skeptical eyebrow when the president of your group answers, "Just give the news to the newspapers."

Well, the president has given you a good definition of your job, but like any other job, there's a right way and a wrong way to do it.

THE FOLLOWING are a few suggestions for publicity chairmen to use in their own submitting material to the County Journal.

All items should be typed double-spaced, using only one side of the paper. If typewriter is not available, please write clearly and print names.

The first paragraph should tell what the event is, who is sponsoring it, when and where it will take place. Items should be limited to essential data with a minimum of names and material not of general interest.

All names should be reported in full (Mrs. William Smith, not Mrs. Smith or Mrs. W. Smith).

DUE TO SPACE limitations, we are unable to print announcements of all ordinary monthly meetings (unless there is to be installation of officers, a special speaker or a panel discussion, etc., in which case name the officers, speaker, panelists, etc.). We are likewise unable to carry accounts of past events unless something of unusual note took place.

The absolute deadline is Tuesday-noon of each week (Monday noon when a holiday falls on a Tuesday or Wednesday). However, submission of material a few days in advance of the deadline will be to our mutual advantage.

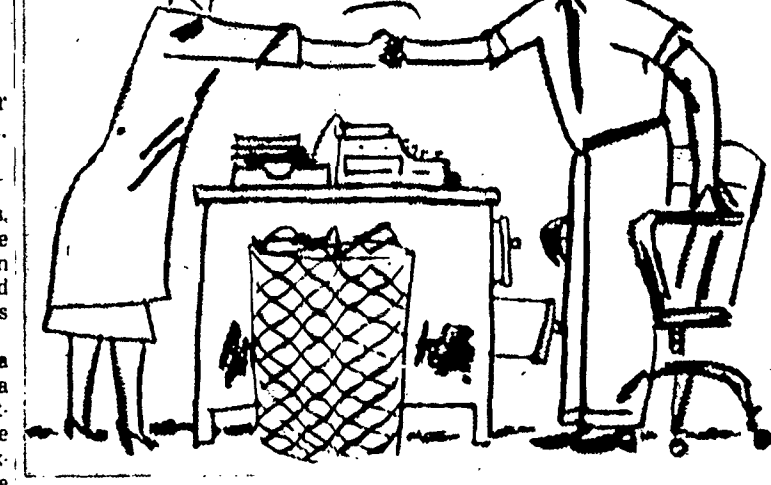
Non-Catholics Get Bid To Visit Catholic Schools

St. Paul, Minn. —(RNS)— An invitation to non-Catholics to view parochial schools might clear up some of the conflict over their status, Archbishop William O. Brady has suggested.

Commenting on the recent controversy over a bill proposing tax relief for parents of parochial and private school children, the head of the Roman Catholic archdiocese of St. Paul wrote in his weekly column in the Catholic Bulletin, archdiocesan organ:

"WE CATHOLICS are quite happy with our country and our constitution... (but) we simply cannot understand anyone who writes that the public school system ought to have a monopoly of education."

"THERE IS no reason why such a gesture of goodwill couldn't be made in the St. Paul archdiocese, he said."



Rome Officials Seize Film Posters After Pope's Talk

Rome —(RNS)— Some 1,000 film posters were seized by Rome authorities less than a week after Pope Pius XII had condemned immoral movie advertising in the Italian capital.

The posters advertised a French film, "En Efficace La Marguerite" (Plucking the Daisy), starring Brigitte Bardot, which had its world premiere here.

At his traditional audience to Rome's Lenten preachers, the Pope protested indecent movie poster displays in Rome as a violation of the Italy-Vatican concordat which pledges the government to ban anything that may be contrary to "the sacred character of the Eternal City."

Commenting on the Pontiff's talk, the Vatican Radio said the State cannot avoid intervening in such matters as in-

proper film advertising by pretending that morality is not its business.

"The application of ethical principles," the station said, "means preserving the rights of decent citizens, especially the rights of children and young people. It cannot be swayed by consideration for the pretended rights of a single group of grownups—in other words, citizens motivated only by their commercial interests."
