



### Voices From The Cross

And only twenty-four hours before the Easter Festival, this Christ now lying on the cross had prayed: "Father, the hour has come. I have accomplished the work that thou hast given me to do." (John 17:3-4)

These are the thoughts that Christ with even fuller joy now expresses on the cross. "It is finished." Christ has done everything that His Father has asked Him to do.

Finally, the purpose of Christ's life also finds its perfection and consummation here on Calvary. This cross always has been the promised climax and goal of Christ's life in a dramatic foretelling of His death on the cross. Jesus had said to the Jews: "And I, if I be lifted up from the earth, will draw all things to myself." (John 12:32-33)

Now Christ's doctrine of the cross is made plain. "If any one wishes to come after me let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me." (Luke 9:23)

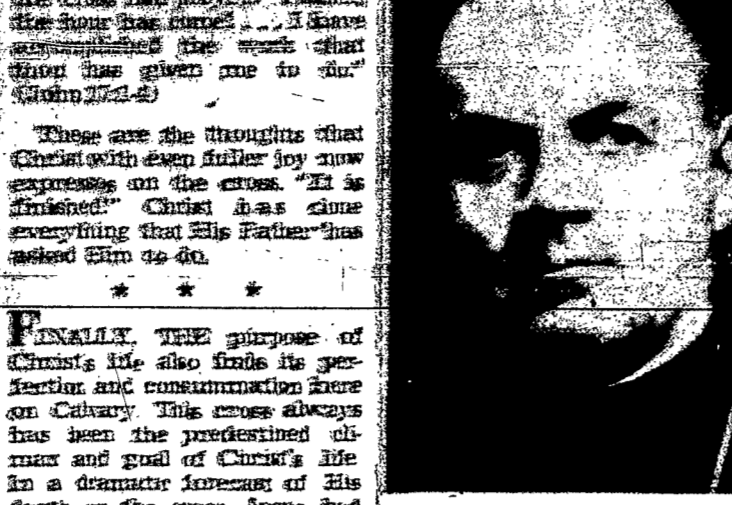
Now we can see the meaning of these words of Christ. On the cross God's love for us is revealed. Only when men draw near to the cross do they discover how much God has done for them. Only under the cross do we hear Christ speak the eternal secret of God's love for men. "It is consummated!"

Enter on Calvary in the person of the Crucified Jesus the prophets of the Old Testament stand vindicated. This day they had foretold:

A week before when he started out for Jerusalem, Jesus had told the Apostles: "Behold we are going up to Jerusalem, and all things that have been written through the prophets concerning the Son of Man will be accomplished. He will be delivered to the Gentiles and will be mocked and scourged, and then will be killed, and three days later he will rise again." (Luke 24:7)

Now all that the prophets of that Christ had foretold is consummated.

HERE ON THE CROSS this carries our His Father's business. Christ does the will of His Father. This very word in the Gospels in His last words to His Father: "Father, I have done what thou hast sent me into the world." (John 17:10)



### American in Korea

Veteran Korean missionary, Miss. Harold W. Henry, Columbian Father from Minnesota, and P r e s e n t Apostolic of Kwangju, has been named Vicar Apostolic of Kwangju. Bishop-elect Henry is the first American born Columbian to be raised to the episcopacy, and the only American prelate with jurisdiction in South Korea.

### Important Lourdes Document Found

London — (CNS) — An important first hand account of the apparitions of the Blessed Virgin in St. Bernadette has been discovered, after being lost for about 75 years.

After the first apparitions St. Bernadette was interrogated by Police Commissioner Jacques of Lourdes. His questions and her answers were recorded and became part of the heritage of the Jacques family.

Eventually one of the commissioner's descendants gave the document to a parish priest. It remained in the parish until recently in preparation for the centenary celebration here next year, a commissioner began to gather as much information as possible. After much searching they finally tracked down the record.

(Continued from Page 1) Social life is kept at minimum during the school year and costs Moya about \$2.00 a week. During the summer home with her mother Mrs. Helen Neville, Moya works in a Buffalo doctor's office earning about \$35 for a 26 hour week.

A majority of the Nazareth College girls have part-time jobs that take care of most of their expenses during the school year. Full time summer jobs enable them to save their tuition and fees and set up a small capital account to "top" during the school year for extraordinary expenses.

Little higher Joseph Butler, a junior pre-medical student from Waterstown, N.Y. pays \$524 a year tuition. Added to this are \$37 for "extras" and \$105 for physics and lab fees. Books average around \$50.

Joseph rooms with three other students in an apartment that was a real "find." His room amounts to only \$5 a week. About \$12 a week are spent on groceries and another \$5 for entertainment.

Asked if they felt the drudgery of "living on a shoestring" was worth it, both Moya and Joseph said that "it actually isn't so bad, since nearly all your classmates are in the same boat."

"Besides when you do get your sneakers," Moya added, "you KNOW you have earned it!"
