

Booklet Outlines Cause Advanced For Archbishop

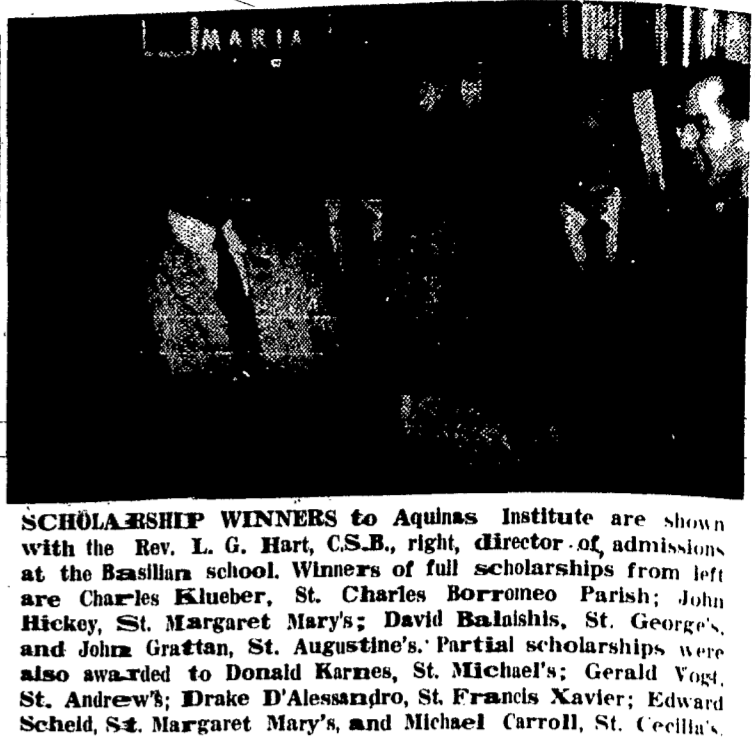
Lithuanians of the Rochester Diocese are reading a booklet just published describing the life of Bishop George Matulevicius-Matulevicius, saintly prelate of their homeland who died in 1927.

The booklet outlines the life of Archbishop Matulevicius, titular Archbishop of Aduli, Apostolic Visitor to Lithuania, Reformer of the Congregation of the Marian Fathers of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary and Founder of the Congregation of the Sisters of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

THE ARCHBISHOP lived from 1871 to 1927. He died Jan. 29, 1927 in Kaunas, Lithuania. Progress made in the cause and a review of the Archbishop's life are contained in the booklet. A prayer for his Beatitude and Canonization also appears.
