Sister Bernard Marie, Educational Director, St. Joseph's Hospital School of Nursing and Sister Marie Michael, Supervisor and Clinical Instructor in Pediatrics attended the Curriculum Conference sponsored by the North Atlantic Regional Council of State Leagues for Nursing and the National League for Nursing. This meeting was held at the Benjamin Franklin Hotel, Philadelphia, April 2 to 5. The conference program centered around the theme, Developing a Functional Curriculum to Teach Effective Patient Care. Topics discussed were: What is nursing care? Facilitating student learning through teacher's use of self. Selection and utilization of resources in a functional curriculum. Evaluation in teaching and learning, and Program development through staff development and growth. Various methods of teaching were demonstrated, such as, role-playing, observational techniques, teacher-student discussions, and audio-visual techniques. The conference was under the direction of Miss Florence Elliott, National League for Nursing Staff Member. Key speakers were: Mrs. France Kreuter, Teachers College, Columbia University; Dr. Paul Witt, Teachers College, Columbia University; Miss Catherine Norris, University of Colorado School of Nursing; Miss Eleanor Anderson, Orthopedic Nursing Consultant, National League of Nurses; and Dr. Benjamin Rosner, University of Buffalo.

Holy Week Services Listed In Churches Of Elmira Area

Catholic churches throughout the Rochester Diocese are set for impressive annual Holy Week rituals.

Pastors this week are preparing palm for blessing and distribution to the people at Sunday Masses. Many parishes have scheduled special Holy Week retreats to climax with the unique ceremonies of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil.

Highlight of Holy Week observance will be services at Sacred Heart Cathedral, "Mother Church" of the Diocese.

Bishop James E. Kearney and Auxiliary Bishop Lawrence B. Casey will preside at the dramatic rites in the Rochester Cathedral. Ceremonies at the Cathedral and in all parish churches will follow the pattern established last year by Pope Pius XII restoring the rituals to their original schedule and simpler form. In accord with the Pope's revision, all the people are urged to take an active part in the rites, responding to the priest's prayers and receiving Holy Communion. BISHOP KEARNEY will celebrate the Mass of the Christ Holy Thursday at 9 a. m. to bless the holy oils used throughout the Diocese for baptism, confirmation, ordination, and extreme unction. Communion will be given at this Mass and the other Holy Thursday Masses as listed below. Solemn Mass of the Last Supper will be celebrated by Bishop Casey at 7:45 p. m. Holy Thursday evening. He will also preside at Good Friday's liturgy commemorating Christ's sufferings and death at 2:30 p. m., and celebrate the first Mass of Easter at midnight on Holy Saturday.

OTHER SPECIAL SERVICES scheduled by Bishop Casey at the Cathedral include Mass at 5:30 p. m. Monday and Tuesday of Holy Week, Holy Thursday low Masses at 7 a. m. and 5:30 p. m. Father Gereon Lindsay, O.F.M. Cap. will conduct a Holy Week retreat opening Wednesday at 7:45 p. m. He will also preach Good Friday at 2:10 p. m. and at Holy Saturday's midnight Mass. Stations of the Cross will be held Good Friday at 1:45 p. m. and 7:45 p. m.

CONFESSIONS will be heard Monday through Wednesday at 7 to 7:30 a. m., and 4:30 to 5:45 p. m.; Thursday at 4:30 to 5:45 p. m. after the evening Mass; Friday after evening services; and Saturday, 3:30 to 6 p. m., and 7:30 to 9 p. m. Holy Week services will be conducted in the Elmira area as submitted below:
