The Holy Season Closes

A paragraph caught by chance in one of the Catholic papers stirred my imagination: "No doubt this is cowardice," writes Pierre Barbet, M.D., "but I hold that one must either have heroic virtue or else fall to understand; that one must be either responsible in order to do the Way of the Cross, or no longer can" (bold ours).

This is an excerpt from "A Doctor at Calvary: The Passion of Our Lord Jesus Christ as Described by a Surgeon."

Having joined other parishioners in informal "Making the Stations" a seven-ten-minute bobbing up and down the two side aisles of our church, and the more formal "Way of the Cross" on Friday evenings during Lent, we decided to take a look at the book. After reading it, we find it a must for Holy Week.

If you haven't yet read this book—it's in many Lenten lists—pick it up for Good Friday. It is read by the author of this column several weeks ahead of Good Friday—but that day will always have more significance to said columnist.

If you don't have time for the entire text on Good Friday, take up Chapter XII, a meditation, and read the rest of the book later, certainly by next Lent.

The author, Dr. Barbet, studied the Holy Shroud of Turin, equally ready to find it an absurd fraud or to recognize its authenticity as the actual shroud in which Our Lord was wrapped after His crucifixion. Dr. Barbet states that "the subtlety of the shroud, from the point of view of anatomy and physiology, is a scientific fact," though making no claim to provide a complete and definite solution as to the problem of the Holy Shroud.

Tying in his studies of the shroud with intensive studies of the Gospels (read in the originals), interpreting the findings in the light of his scientific
