Father Kavanagh wrote:

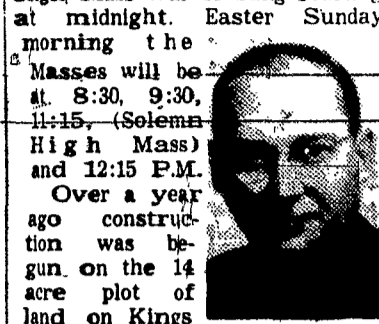

First Services Scheduled At Christ The King Church

First services in the new Church of Christ The King, will take place with the ceremonies of the Vigil of Easter beginning at 10:45 p.m. on Holy Saturday evening. Solemn High Mass will be sung starting at midnight. Easter Sunday morning the



Masses will be at 8:30, 9:30, 11:15. (Solemn High Mass) and 12:15 P.M.

Over a year ago construction was begun on the 14 acre plot of land on Kings

Mgr. Mahoney Highway, between Ridge Road East and Thius Avenue. The building contains a church, an eight room classroom school, a parish hall and convent. Funds were raised by parishioners on Palm Sunday March 25, 1956. The hall has been designed for conversion to eight additional classrooms.

THE HALL was opened on the Feast of Christ the King on Oct. 26, 1956 and Mass has been celebrated on Sundays since that time. The school was opened with the beginning of the second semester this past January under the direction of the Sisters of St. Joseph with Sister M. Patricia as principal. In March the Sisters moved into the convent. Last

week ground was broken for a parish rectory on the North end of the church property.

Monsignor Charles J. Mahoney is pastor. Architects of the building were Martin, McGraw and Ward. General Contractor is Frank C. Maggio and Brothers.

Modernistic in design the church has a seating capacity of 820 persons, contains a special enclosed room for mothers with infants and a choir room. The pews and altars are inscribed with the Greek letters Chi-Rho, the special emblem of Christ the King. The sanctuary is of paneled flexwood.
