Msgr. Lambert To Address First Friday Club Men

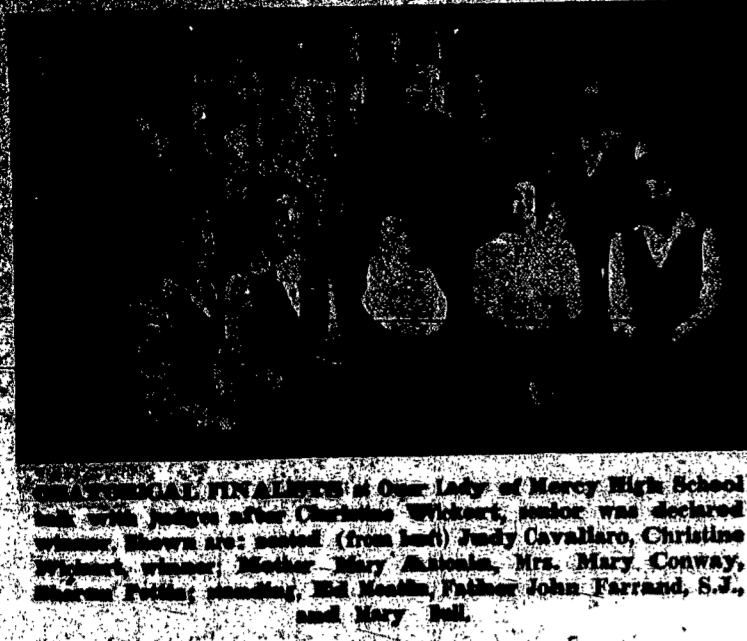

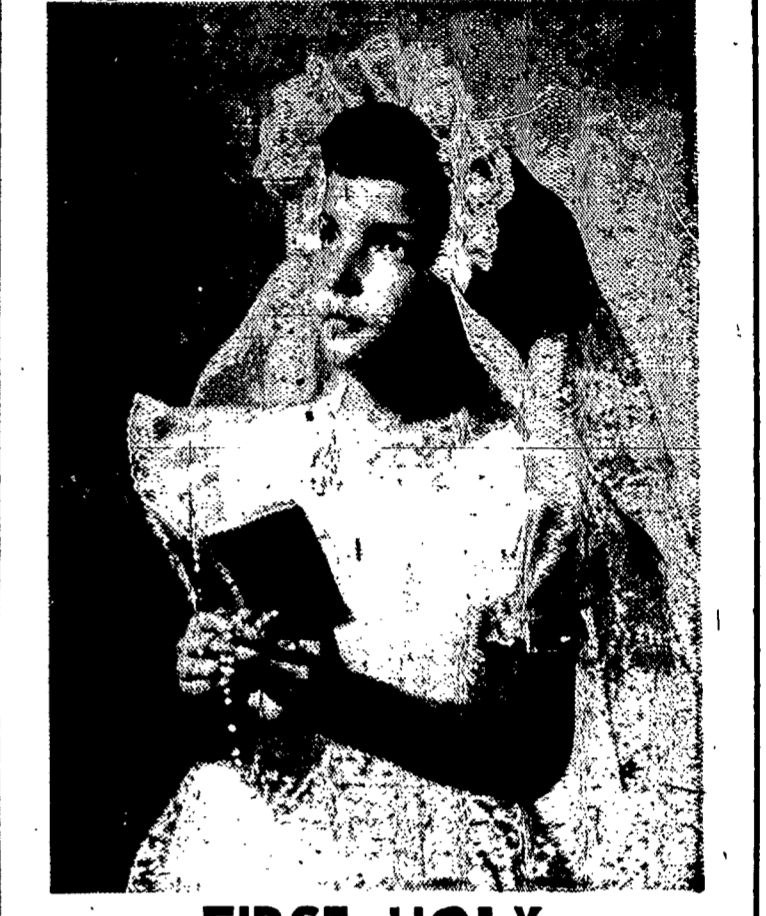
