Bishop To Open May Radio Rosary

Month of May, traditionally dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary, will be marked in the Diocese of Rochester by a special series of nightly radio broadcasts.

Priests of the diocese will lead in the recitation of the Rosary over Station WSAW each evening at 7 p. m.

BROADCASTS WILL originate in the sanctuary of St. Francis of Assisi Church, Orange and Whitney Streets, Rochester, and will be followed by Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.

His Excellency Bishop James E. Kearney will inaugurate the series on Wednesday, May 1, according to the Rev. Joseph A. Cirincione, director of the Family Rosary for Peace program.

The Bishop will be accompanied by student nurses of St. Mary's Hospital, who will make the responses.

Father Cirincione stated that laymen would resume leading the Rosary on the broadcasts in June.

Monsignor Varga To Talk On 'Silent Hungary'

Monsignor Bela Varga, president of the Hungarian National Council, and Chairman of its executive committee, will speak in the Auditorium of Our Lady of Mercy High School on Wednesday evening, May 8, at 8:15 p. m.

Monsignor Varga's visit to Rochester is sponsored by the Rochester Diocesan Council, National Council of Catholic Women. The Hungarian prelate's topic will be Hungary Today and he will answer questions. Monsignor Varga has been called "The Voice of Silent Hungary".

MONSIGNOR VARGA calls the recent revolt of Hungarian men, women and children—the Hungarian freedom fighters—a spiritual revolution against the tyrannical material forces of Russian Communism.

Mrs. Rains has announced that other civic groups will be invited to cooperate in making Monsignor Varga's visit to Rochester a success.

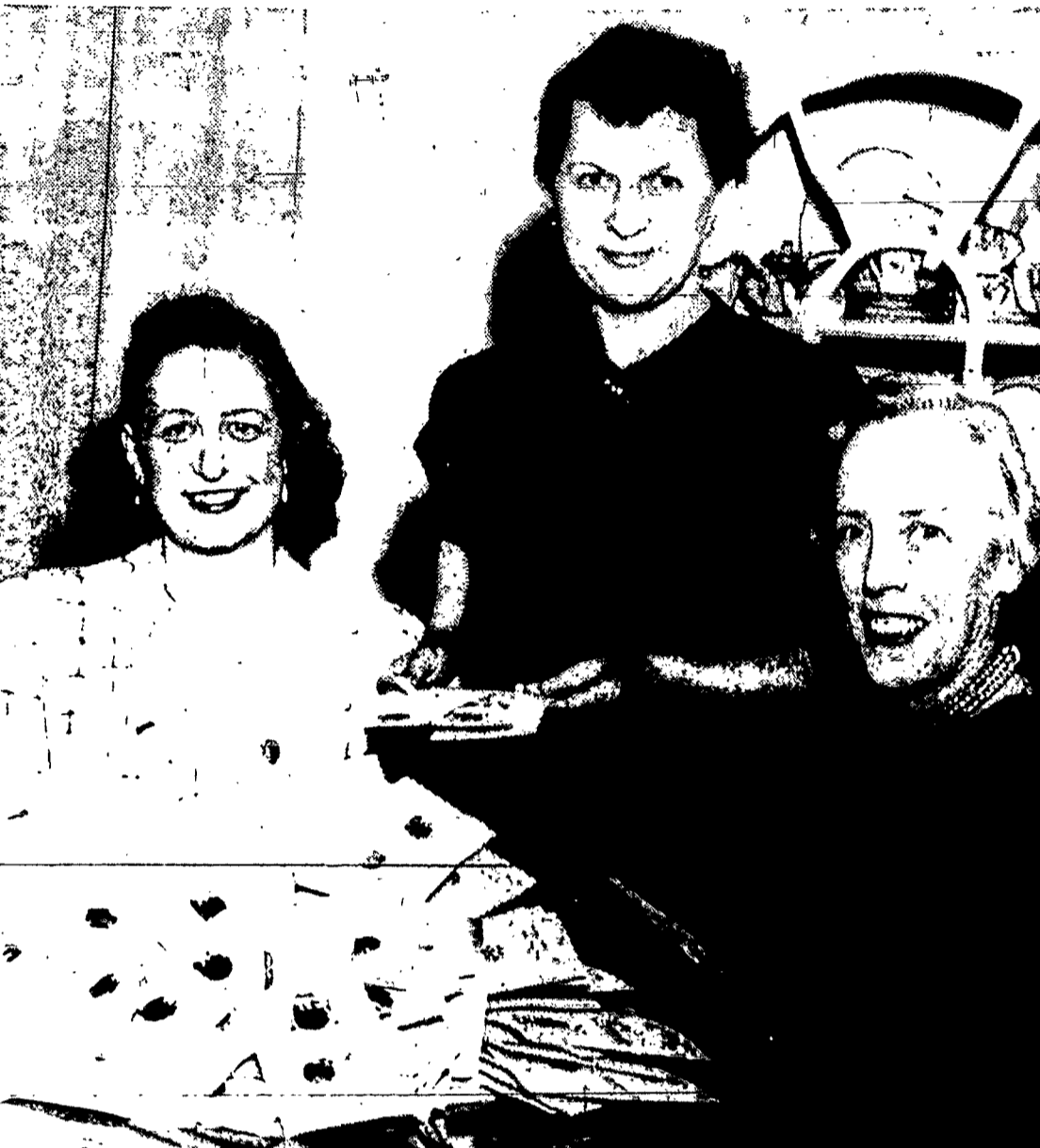
St. Anne Drive Passes Total Of \$250,000

A total of \$251,059 was pledged during Holy Week, about 125 percent of the \$200,000 minimum for construction of the new St. Anne Church, according to Monsignor William J. Naughton, pastor.

As a result of a complete canvass of the parish by some 300 men volunteer workers, the above total was almost realized in the two hour solicitation period on Sunday, April 14.

Increasing population of St. Anne's parish has necessitated the replacement of the frame church building which was dedicated in 1930. Since 1950, the time of Monsignor Naughton's appointment as pastor, the parish population has almost doubled.

Monsignor Naughton expressed his appreciation and gratitude to all the parishioners who contributed so generously toward the campaign and especially to all the workers who labored so hard and zealously to make the campaign a complete success.

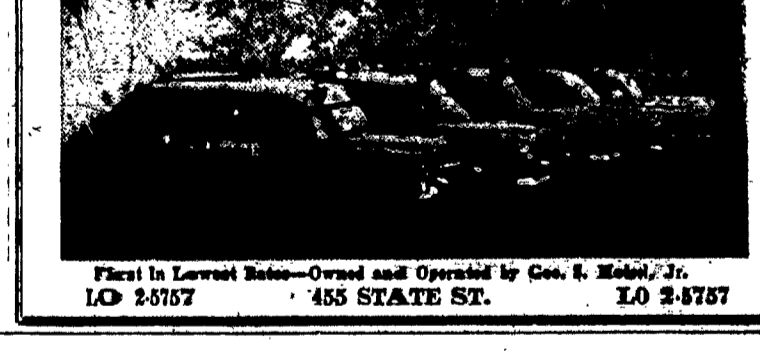
