Diocesan Schools Win Scholarships

Forty-two students of Rochester Diocesan Catholic High schools were awarded New York State Regents Scholarships, it was announced this week by the Education Department.

Holders of scholarships will be entitled to \$300 per year for the four years of their college course while attending any college in the State of New York approved by the Regents for this purpose.

OVER 30,000 candidates representing 1,200 secondary schools of New York State took the scholarship tests last Jan. 21 and 22. Cost to the state for the 1957 winners announced this week will amount to \$2,112,000.
