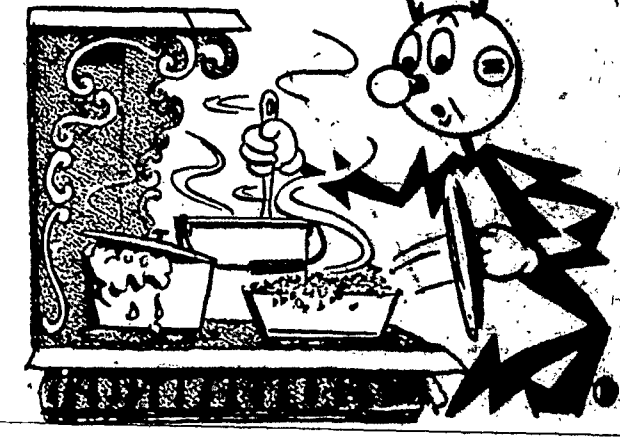
## State CWV Convention Events Set
