### 'Holy Angels' New Name Adopted By Guild Assisting Girls' Home

Members of the Good Shepherd Guild—which for 27 years has provided assistance to Holy Angels Home on Winton Road, North this week changed the name of the 2900-member organization and elected a new slate of officers. It hereafter will be known as Holy Angels Guild.

At its meeting Monday in Hotel Seneca the guild elected Mrs. William B. Bertsch to succeed Miss Alice Moreland as president. Officers will be installed at 2:30 p.m. Saturday, May 25, at a tea in the Chatterbox Club, North Goodman St.

To be inducted with Mrs. Bertsch are Mrs. Robert L. Bieher, first vice president; Mrs. Richard L. Weider, second vice president; Mrs. Wendell F. Ryan, corresponding secretary; Mrs. David J. Warner Jr., recording secretary; Miss Helen Connell, treasurer.

**TWO MAJOR REASONS** were advanced for the group's change of name. One was to identify the organization more closely with the name of the institution for which it labors, Holy Angels Home. The second principal reason was to conform to the current

purpose of the nuns who conduct the Winton Road convent and its school for girls.

Holy Angels Home for Girls was founded in Rochester in 1930. It is conducted by 13 "Holy Angels Nuns." Its primary purpose is to provide a substitute social experience for teenage girls whose own homes, for any of a variety of reasons, might be inadequate in terms of education opportunities or character formation.

There are presently 31 girls, ranging in age from 9 to 16, who are at this "home away from home." The Sisters provide for them both grammar school and high school classes, the latter being a two-year commercial course. The home is registered with the New York State Department of Social Welfare, and has been receiving girls, irrespective of race, creed or color, from not only Monroe County but the surrounding Western and Central New York.

**THE HOME** is conducted by Sisters of Our Lady of Charity of Refuge. In the Rochester Diocese they have been known

familiarly as "Good Shepherd Sisters" to distinguish them from the Daughters of Charity who conduct St. Mary's Hospital in Rochester.

The title, "Good Shepherd Sisters," conflicts however with another order of nuns doing similar work—the Sisters of Our Lady of Charity of the Good Shepherd. It is for this reason that the nuns here will hereafter be called "Holy Angels Nuns."

They are presently 31 girls, ranging in age from 9 to 16, who are at this "home away from home." The Sisters provide for them both grammar school and high school classes, the latter being a two-year commercial course.
