Monsignor Gannon was principal speaker at the final first Saturday luncheon before the summer recess. Luncheons have been sponsored by the St. Stephen Deanery, Diocesan Council of Catholic Women in honor of Our Lady of Fatima. They will resume in October.

Monsignor Gannon used, as the basis of his talk, the Scriptural account of the Blessed Mother Mary and St. Joseph seeking the Christ Child, when He becomes separated from them at the age of 12.

"THEY SOUGHT their Divine Son first among their kindred or, in other words, among men and they failed to find Him. Finally they went to the Temple, the House of God, and found the Child Jesus instructing the learned doctors. The Scriptural passage concludes with the terse account of Jesus' going down to Nazareth where He was subject to His mother and foster father, and where He advanced in grace in wisdom," Monsignor Gannon told the group.

He added that there are two important lessons to be learned from that portion of Sacred Scripture. "The first is that Jesus Christ cannot be found in the material world.

"Remember that Our Blessed Lord built a house for Himself when He said:

"Thou art Peter and upon this rock I shall build My Church and the gates of Hell shall not prevail against it. Seek Christ in His Church where He dwells in the Blessed Sacrament," Monsignor Gannon said.
