Holy Shroud Lecture Given By Fr. Shamon

A Shamon, assistant pastor of Our Lady of the Lake Church, Watkins Glen was heard in a lecture on the Holy Shroud of Turin at the St. Plus Roman Altar Society first annual dinner and daughter's dinner, May 11.

The dinner, attended by 125 persons, was held in Cohocton Central High School. Father Shamon pointed out that the evidence presented by this sacred relic of Christendom proves incontrovertibly that this Shroud preserved in the Cathedral of Turin Italy and guarded for centuries by the Royal House of Savoy, is the authentic wrapping sheet which held the body of Christ in the tomb.

THE LECTURER said that the impression on this cloth has been thoroughly investigated by the world of science and the authenticity of the Shroud was defended on the floor of the French Academy of Sciences by an illustrious scientist of the famed Sorbonne Institute in Paris, Dr. J. Delage, a professional agnostic. He defended its authenticity by developing three propositions:

- 1—The impression was not a painting because of the absence of pigment and oil which was the only method of painting known to the artists at the time the Holy Shroud certainly existed in 1353.
- 2—The impression actually came from a human corpse.
- 3—That corpse was the body of Christ.

The blood markings on this Shroud coincide perfectly with the wounds known to have been inflicted on only one person in history, Jesus Christ.

Plus IX of happy memory speaking of the Holy Shroud of Turin, was quoted, "We are speaking now not as Pope, but as a scientist. We have studied carefully the evidence presented, upholding the authenticity of this sacred heritage of mankind. There have been objections but they do not stand up."

Mrs. Charles Klefer presided at the banquet.

The invocation was delivered by the Rev. Herbert Sturmer, pastor of St. Plus Parish, Cohocton. Father Shamon was introduced by Mrs. Fee K. Edmond.
