## Basilian-Jesuit Brothers Advance In Noted Work

The Rev. Dr. Robert G. Miller, C.S.B., son of Mr. and Mrs. William F. Miller of Birch St., has been named associate editor of The New Scholasticism, a quarterly philosophy journal according to word received here this week.

At the same time his brother, the Rev. Dr. Richard Miller, S.J., announced that the eclipse of the sun on May 6 as viewed from the Philippines confirmed Albert Einstein's theory of relativity.

FATHER RICHARD MILLER, who observed the rare solar phenomenon, said it confirmed Einstein's theory in that there was order in the universe indicating exactly where things are by the minutes and seconds.

Photos taken of the happening were so clear that sun spots, thought 200 years ago to be planets, were clearly visible. Father Miller takes photos through the telescope at the Manila Observatory of the Jesuit Fathers.

Father Robert Miller also presented a paper on "The Existence of God in Contemporary Philosophy at the annual convention of the Michigan Academy of Arts, Science and Letters held at Wayne University.

## Fr. Edward Frank To Sing First Solemn Mass

Rev. Edward Frank will be ordained a priest in Worthington, Ohio, Saturday, May 25, and celebrate his first solemn Mass at St. Andrew's Church, Rochester, Sunday, June 2 at 11 a. m.

Archbishop Amleto G. Cicognani, apostolic delegate to the United States, will ordain Father Frank in ceremonies to be held in the pontifical college Josephinum at Worthington.

FATHER FRANK attended St. Andrew's parochial school, Edison Technical high school and following military service studied at St. Andrew's and St. Bernard's seminaries.

He entered the Trappist novitiate at Gethesani, Kentucky, but ill health prevented his continuing the rigorous monastic life. He then completed his preparation for the priesthood at the Ohio seminary.

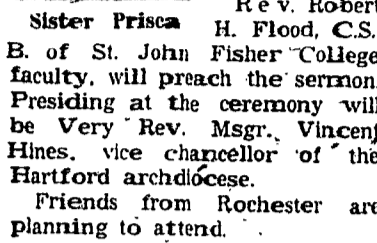
A reception will be held from 3 to 5:30 p.m. at St. Andrew's parish hall following his first solemn Mass.
