

Former 'Point' Chaplain Honored

Mount Vernon, N.Y. — (NC) — Monsignor George G. Murdock, who was chaplain at the U.S. Military Academy, West Point, for 16 years, offered a Mass of Thanksgiving in Sacred Heart Church here in observance of his 40th anniversary as a priest.

Cardinal Spellman presided at the Mass. West Point cadets provided the music for the Mass.

Ordained in St. Patrick's Cathedral, New York, in 1917, Monsignor Murdock served for 12 years as a navy chaplain and became an airplane pilot. He was appointed pastor of Holy Trinity chapel at West Point in 1932, a post he held until he came to Mount Vernon in 1948 as pastor of Sacred Heart Church.

Francis H. Dolan, a nurse with the city Health Department and former nurse at Aquinas Institute, attended the celebration. Miss Dolan, a major in the U.S. Army, served at West Point during Monsignor Murdock's time there.

A letter of regret from His Excellency Bishop Kearney, long a friend of the jubilarian, was read at a luncheon attended by 550 distinguished military and civilian figures.

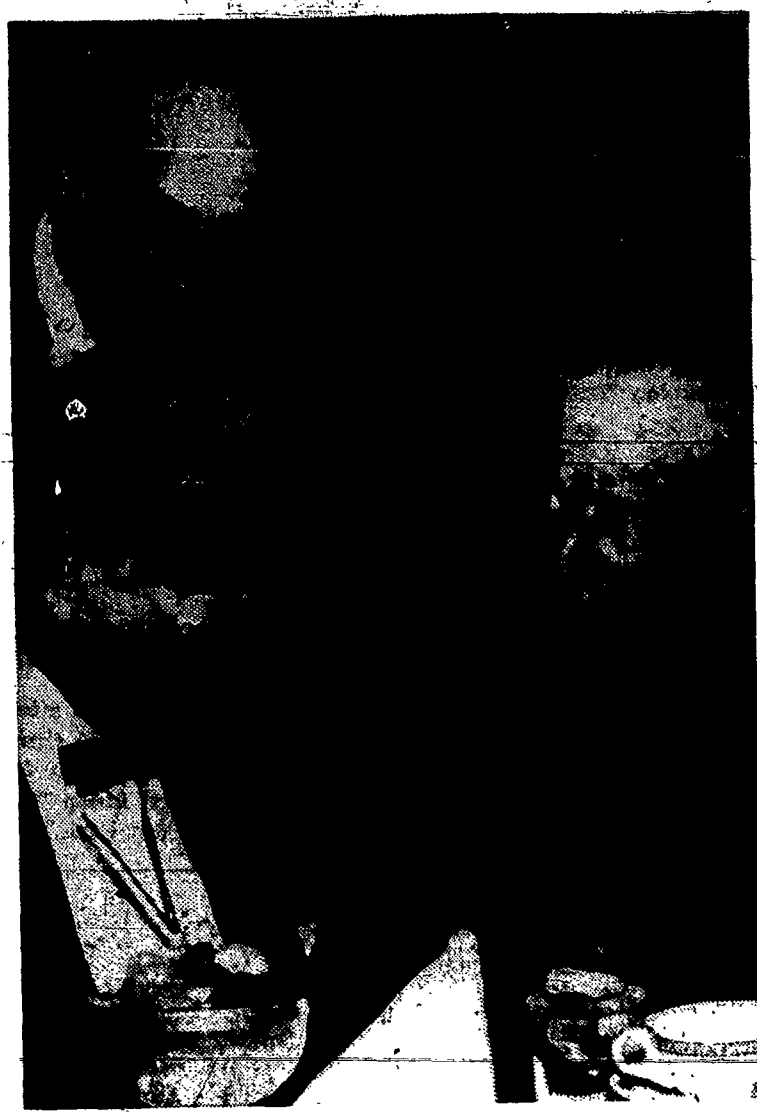

100 in 4th Degree KC Class Named For Bishop

Named in honor of His Excellency Bishop Kearney's Silver Jubilee as Bishop, a class of 100 candidates from all sections of this diocese were inducted into the Fourth Degree of the Knights of Columbus, Sunday in Blessed Sacrament School Hall.

Bishop Kearney was acclaimed by 500 sir knights and ladies at the banquet following in Hotel Sheraton.

The Fourth or Patriotic Degree is important in the present time because it "commits us as Knights of Columbus to the virtue of patriotism, a virtue going into the discard these days," Bishop Kearney said.

The lack of concern for influences at work among intellectual groups and on university campuses to condemn or blot out patriotism was deplored by the Bishop. He urged the Fourth Degree members to join the fight against patriotic obliteration.

WILLIAM M. LENNOX, a supreme director of the K. of C. and Philadelphia Sheriff in his address called for a deep understanding of things given citizens by the United States Constitution. He particularly stressed study of the Fifth Amendment and all it provides.

Raymond L. Nary, master of the Fifth District and in charge of the degree was commended for the success of this first expedition under his direction. Ralph F. Murphy, past faithful navigator, presided at the dinner.

Responding for the class was Monsignor Arthur E. Rattigan, diocesan director of Catholic Charities. Assemblies represented in class were Rochester, Dansville, Canandaigua, New York, Corning, Elmira, Geneva, Ithaca.

Mr. Attridge, 56, first letter carrier to become superintendent of mails, died May 15, 1957 in Strong Memorial Hospital.

Interment was in Holy Sepulchre Cemetery.
