### Queenship Of Mary

Today's feast of the Queenship of Mary, I should like to quote some thoughts on this subject which were published in the current issue of the Immaculate Heart Magazine.

Writing on "Mary's Queenship" and "The Queenship of Mary" in the current issue of the Immaculate Heart Magazine, Louis Pappalardo points out that the feast of Mary's Queenship will be celebrated for the first time on the 31st of this month. The feast will be renewed at the consecration of the human race to the Immaculate Heart of Mary will take place. The yearly renewal of this consecration was commanded by Pope Pius XII in his Marian Year encyclical, Ad Caeli Regnam.

Our Holy Father, in establishing this feast of Mary, the Queen, to be celebrated throughout the world each year on the 31st of May, expressed this wish: May all faithful Christians, therefore, rejoice in subjecting themselves to the rule of the Virgin Mother of God, while in possession of a royal power, yet bound with a maternal love.

A STUDY of the encyclical shows it to be divided into four parts. In the first part there is a reference to the writings of the many Fathers, Doctors, and Popes who have taught of and honored Mary's Queenship. In the second part, the Pope turns to the many references of Mary's Queenship in the sacred liturgy. There are various prayers, such as the "Hail, Holy Queen" which honor her royal dignity. There is the series of queenly titles under which she is addressed in the "Lily of the Blessed Virgin". There are many works of Christian art wherein Mary is depicted as Queen. And there is that wonderful practice of "adorning" images of Mary as Queen. All of these give evidence that Man recognizes and wishes to honor Mary as Queen of heaven and earth.

In the third part of the encyclical, Pope Pius XII calls upon dogma, and shows that Mary is deserving of the titles of Queen by right of her Divine Motherhood, and also because of her role of co-redemptress. "IN THE FOURTH part, he summarizes the reasons for Mary's Queenship and the institution of this feast in her honor. He also orders that the human race be consecrated to the Immaculate Heart of Mary on the same day. Further, he lists the benefits the world will receive as a result of the homage paid to Mary as Queen. In his
