Hibernians Slate 'Briefing' Before Ireland Air Tour

Members of the second Hibernian Pilgrimage to the Shrine of Our Blessed Mother at Knock, Ireland will gather at St. Monica Hall, Genesee St. for a final briefing on Monday evening, June 3.

The 72 members will leave from the Rochester airport on Thursday evening, August 29 and fly aboard a chartered DC6B of the K.L.M. Airlines to Dublin, Ireland. This is one of the largest passenger planes in the world, the previous flight made in 1955 seated 53 persons. ALL PILGRIMS, members of the Ancient Order of Hibernians will journey to Knock in County Mayo, Ireland, and after an overnight visit will return to Dublin and there separate.

Some 35 members will continue as a group and under the leadership of Father Michael P. O'Brien of St. Monica Parish, assisted by Father George S. Wood, director of the Society for the Propagation of the Faith will journey to Lourdes, Monaco, Rome, Luzerne, Switzerland, Paris, London and Dublin. When in Rome an audience with the Holy Father will be petitioned.

The group numbers among its members eight priests from the diocese, ten persons who have made the trip previously, and several from as far away as Philadelphia. Most of the group are men and women born in Ireland and Scotland, the great majority have not seen their homeland for 30-40 years.

THE MEETING on Monday, June 3, will feature William F. Mullane of the Kaitfelsch Travel Agency, who will discuss the necessary items relating to passport, baggage, customs inspection, etc., and Walter Anderson, the County President of the Hibernians who will extend greetings.

Estimated time of plane departure is 6:00 p.m. on August 29 from Rochester Airport, with one scheduled stop at Gander, Newfoundland, landing in Dublin approximately at 4:00 p.m. Dublin time.
