

# Charges Catholics Wage Open War

London (RNS) — Dr. Geoffrey Francis Fisher, Archbishop of Canterbury, accused the Roman Catholic Church in Britain of waging an "open war" against the Anglican Church.

He suggested the formation of a "joint council of churches" and said that "if the Pope would like to come in as chairman we would all welcome him."

## Paper Challenges 'Open War' Charge

London (RNS) — The Universe, Catholic weekly here, challenged Dr. Geoffrey Francis Fisher, Archbishop of Canterbury, to back with facts his charge that the Catholic Church in Britain is waging an "open war" against the Church of England.

Dr. Fisher's attack, which drew immediate denials from Catholic leaders, was understood to have been motivated by concern over campaigns by Catholic groups in England to win converts.

## Convert From Judaism Marks Priesthood Jubilee

New York (NC) — When a Jew is converted to the Catholic Church, he finds the very Jewish religion he thought he was abandoning.

This was the sermon theme chosen by Father Arthur B. Klyber, C.S.B., on the occasion of the silver jubilee of his ordination. The Redemptorist priest spoke from firsthand knowledge. He is a convert from Judaism.

HE OFFERED his jubilee Mass in the Church of the Holy Redeemer where he was ordained. In attendance were 150 Jewish-Catholics, one of the largest groups ever assembled.

# Germans Told Socialist Vote Perils Freedom

Bonn (NC) — The West German Chancellor and a bishop have both issued warnings to Catholics not to vote for socialists in the coming West German elections.

Chancellor Konrad Adenauer of the Federal Republic of Germany told a convention of 40,000 Catholic men in Bamberg that whether Germany and all Europe remain Christian or become communist will hinge greatly on the outcome of the Bundestag (parliament) elections next September 15.

## Pontiff Denounces Slums As 'Plague'

Vatican City (RNS) — Pope Pius XII denounced slums as a "perilous plague of contemporary society" and urged governments in Europe to take prompt measures to eradicate them.

In solemn, earnest words the Pontiff deplored the fact that slums continue to exist even in many of the richer European countries.

## Miller's Wife Movie Condemned

New York (NC) — The National Legion of Decency has evaluated as Class C—condemned the Italian-made movie, "Miller's Beautiful Wife."

The Legion issued the following objection against the picture: "The virtue of purity throughout this film is ridiculed by reason of an unmitigated emphasis on illicit love, suggestive costuming, dialogue and situations. Light treatment of marriage and football and baseball coaches."

Dr. Newsum in his commencement talk pointed out three phases where "Christian citizenship" faces a "critical challenge."

He stressed his personal conviction that Christian living is a highly personalized accomplishment which cannot be attained by "hiding" in some favorite group or organization.
