

Sisters Of Mercy Slate Centenary

Close to 5,000 people witnessed four performances of an original jubilee pageant, "The Night of Mercy," staged at Mercy High last night, May 25th. Produced by Sister Mary Peter and Sister Mary Plus of the high school faculty and using a cast of 360 singers, dancers, speech choir and players, the play recalled the highlights of the Mercy Sisters' growth from 1831 in Dublin to the present day in Rochester.

Rosary Tour To Lourdes Centennial Set In '58

The National Lourdes Centennial Rosary Pilgrimage in 1958 will be led by the Rev. Joseph A. Cirincione, pastor of St. Francis of Assisi Church, and director of the Family Rosary For Peace broadcasts in Rochester, the Catholic Travel League-Office of Washington announced today.

This will be Father Cirincione's 11th European pilgrimage, two of which in 1949 and 1950, he led for the Catholic Travel League.

Pilgrims will sail on the new ship of the Greek Line, T.S.S. Olympia on July 4, 1958.

REASON FOR this pilgrimage is the Centennial of the apparitions of the Blessed Mother to Bernadette at Lourdes in France. Our Lady appeared 18 times between Feb. 11 and March 25, 1858. The Centennial is expected to draw the largest number of pilgrims to the shrine in its 100 year history.

Father Cirincione was chosen because of his association with the Family Rosary for Peace. Remembering that Our Lady recited the Rosary with Bernadette at Lourdes, the pilgrims will recite the Rosary in common each day on ship, plane or wherever they may be, the director said.

The Olympia is a 23,000 ton vessel launched in 1953. This modern ship will take its passengers directly to Lisbon where they will disembark for a visit to the shrine at Fatima.

TWO SECTIONS will comprise the pilgrimage: Tour A taking passengers who will return on the Olympia and sail from Naples on August 15; and Tour B, pilgrims flying from Rome to Cairo and then to the Holy Land on August 15. After 10 days in the Holy Land, they will fly back to New York from Tel Aviv, arriving only a day after the first group lands in New York.

'Sugar King' Dies In Auto Crash

Lawrence Baiste, the "Sugar King" of New Iberia, La., honored last July in Rochester, with Miss Mary Ann Broussard, the "Sugar Queen" was killed in an automobile accident on May 26, 1957, according to information received by friends here.
