

Remedial Reading Classes Listed By Sisters Of Mercy

Classes in remedial reading will be conducted in four schools of the Diocese of Rochester by the Sisters of Mercy of Catherine McAuley Junior College in the month of July. It was announced at the college today.

The classes are scheduled at Our Lady of Mercy High School, Rochester; St. Thomas School, Irondequoit Monday through Friday mornings throughout the month of July; Holy Family School, Auburn, July 1 to July 26 and St. Mary School, Corning, July 2 to July 26.

Sister Mary de Pazzi, dean of Catherine McAuley Junior College is director of the reading laboratory and coordinator of its three branches, in Rochester, Auburn and Corning.

REGISTRATION for classes at Mercy High and St. Thomas school will be conducted at Our Lady of Mercy High School, June 30 through June 14, Monday through Friday, during school hours.

A personal interview with a parent is requested at the time of registration.

Each class in these two schools will be of an hour's duration, the hours extending from nine until 12. A complete testing program including Stanford-Binet IQ, personality and reading diagnosis and achievement tests, is part of the regular laboratory procedure during the 20 class summer session.

A SPECIAL registration day, Tuesday, June 11 has been designated by St. Thomas School for registrants in that area who would prefer registering there.

Attractive teaching media, including tape recorders, movies, film strips, dramatic scripts, word wheels, soundsticks and a well stocked children's library are comprised in the Reading (Continued on page 8)

Rev. Paul J. McCarthy of the Society of Jesus and son of Mr. and Mrs. Patrick J. McCarthy, 79 Enterprise St., will be ordained to the Holy Priesthood on June 22 at Fordham University in New York City by Auxiliary Bishop Joseph M. Perricone.

Father McCarthy will celebrate his first Solemn High Mass at 12:15 p.m. on Sunday, June 30, in the Church of Our Lady of Good Counsel on Brooks Avenue, Rochester.

Officers of the Mass will be Rev. Leo V. Smith, pastor, Assistant Priest; Rev. Lawrence E. Ward, Deacon, and Rev. Joseph W. Dalley, Subdeacon. The sermon will be preached by Rev. Joseph A. Marius, S.J., of Holy Cross College, Worcester, Mass.

A reception will be held in Our Lady of Good Counsel School Auditorium on Ernestine Street from 4:30 until 7 o'clock.

FATHER MCCARTHY, a native Rochesterian, received his grammar school education under the Sisters of St. Francis at Our Lady of Good Counsel School, and attended St. Andrew Seminary from 1938 to 1944.

In the summer of that year he entered the Jesuit Order at St. Andrew-on-Hudson in Poughkeepsie. After finishing the two-year novitiate and one year of classical studies at St. Andrew, Father McCarthy was sent to the Jesuit House of Studies at Spring Hill in Alabama.

The next three years were spent here in the study of philosophy and science.

During the scholastic year 1950-1951 he was instructor in Chemistry at Regis High School in New York City, and during the next three years, a graduate student in Chemistry in Worcester.

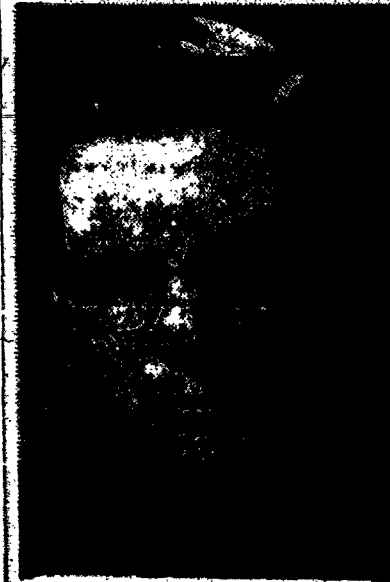
Father McCarthy was awarded the M.S. degree by Holy Cross College in 1952, and the Ph.D. degree by Clark University in 1955. From September 1954 to the present, he has been pursuing theological studies at the Jesuit Seminary at Woodstock, Md.
