

## AMONG WOMEN Mother Stopped Talking!

As speaker at an annual banquet one time, I was introduced with the remark that since I am the mother of four children I have considerable material to write and speak.

As I started my talk, I quickly corrected my impression that I make a practice of writing about my own family. I added that my happy home life would be a thing of the past if I used the members of my family as subjects of any article or talk.

However, I shall depart from my usual procedure today to tell of what happened at our house when Mother stopped talking.

While I was suffering from an attack of laryngitis, the doctor and other interested persons had suggested that I rest my throat by not talking. The gleam of

amusement which shone in the eyes of my family at these words suggested that while such a change might be recommended, it could never be accomplished.

Then I remembered that my own family used to love to be called how concerned my mother had been because I had been slow to start talking. Someone always remembered that in later years an uncle had remarked, "Once she got started, you couldn't stop her!"

I also remembered a saying that the tongue is the only sharp instrument that grows sharper by constant use. All these factors combined to motivate my turning to Our Lady of Silence and resolving to do no more unnecessary talking.

Well, the stopping of the mouth of an ocean liner in mid-Atlantic could have created no greater amazement, bewilderment and anxiety. Reactions were different depending on the individual ages and temperaments, but the total result was that everyone noticed the difference.

ONE OF MY boys sought me out before dinner to inquire anxiously, "Say, Mom, don't you feel good?" I replied that I was in excellent health and wondered why he asked. In true boy fashion he answered trying to reveal as little of his thoughts as possible, "Oh, I don't know why, but you seem so quiet!"

One of my daughters could read through conversation, TV, family debates, and gentle reminders that it is time for a little help with household work.

The state of her conscience was indicated in her question, "Mom, are you angry with me?" Her reason, when asked, was identical with her brother's. She considered my silence out of character and unnatural and interpreted it as a sign of disapproval.

ONE OF THE youngsters must be like me. He talks all the time so my silence just gave him greater scope. Enjoying the experience of having the floor all to himself, he did not notice my silence.

The smallest child didn't say anything but she just came out to the kitchen, put her arms around me and laid her head against me. She needed the reassurance that this was Mommie, that everything was all right, I was not without vociferating any thoughts.

Well, the laryngitis is gone and I think I'll start talking again. It's hard to change the habits of a lifetime, both my own of talking and that of my family of listening. But I know now how to express without scolding my displeasure and how to communicate without complaining any physical disability. Silence can convey so much!

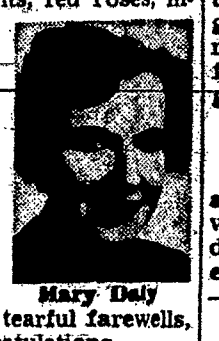
