St. Jerome's of East Rochester, Campaign Committee met in the Parish CYA Hall on Tuesday, June 4, at 7:30 p.m. to discuss plans for their \$150,000 Financial Need Appeal.

The four Sectional Vice-Chairmen, Austin McCormick, Roland McDonald, Robert Kohler and Louis Raschiator reported a combined total of 308 men had volunteered to assist in the General Solicitation of the Parish scheduled for Sunday, June 16. It is planned to complete the entire solicitation between the hours of 1:30 p.m. and 3:30 p.m. with the men reporting the results at the Parish Center immediately after completing their calls.

THE CAMPAIGN will be conducted on a pledge basis covering a three-year payment period. Alterations and expansion of the rectory and convent, as well as payment on the present parish debt, are the purposes for the campaign.

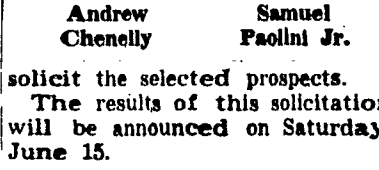

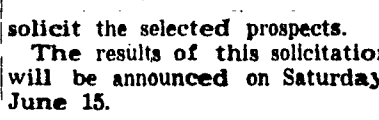
