

Construction by non · public schools and colleges totaled \$40,-OC 3,000 during the month, \$1,-OOO,000 above April, but \$2,000,000 below May, 1956.

Building by non-public hospitals and institutions amounted to \$24,000,000 in May, as against \$21,000,000 for the same month in 1956. Construction activity in this field is so far 26 per cent above the level of a year ago.

## 589 Adults Confirmed By Bishop Casey

Nearly 600 adults received the Sacrament of Confirmation in Pentecost Sunday services (June 9) at Sacred Heart Cathhedral and in Corpus Christi Church, Roch-

HIS EXCELLENCY, Auxiliary Bishop Lawrence B. Casey, confirmed 292 at the Cathedral Sunday afternoon, and then administered the same sacrament to an additional 297 in an evening serv ce at Corpus Christi.

Most of the 589 are recent converts to the Catholic faith.

In his talk to the candidates before Confirmation, Bishop Casey told them they share in the spostles' duty "to go out" as missionaries of the faith.

"Doors are opened to you, which are closed to priests," he told them and urged them by their example and prudent invitation to bring additional converts to the Catholic Church.


