Holy Angels Home Fund Campaign Extended, Pledges Total \$38,217

Extension of the fund drive for Holy Angels Home to Thursday, June 27, was announced this week as the 600 committee members battled the record heat in efforts to make their prospect calls.

Funds are being sought throughout the Rochester area toward construction of a proposed monastery and classroom addition to the Home, located at 1326 Winton Rd. N., where education and training are provided teenage girls in need of special guidance.

Both Martin Q. Moll, general chairman, and Daniel E. Macken, special gifts chairman announced that solicitation will continue, with the final report meeting for both committees scheduled at 8 p.m. Thursday, June 27, in Columbus Civic Centre ballroom.

PLEDGES TOTALING \$38,217 were reported through Monday, June 17, representing only 32 percent of the prospect calls. Many workers said that soaring temperatures and busy schedules limited their ability to canvass all their prospects.

Moll told the committee this week that while the average of reported pledges was very good, the volume of returns was lacking. Noting that many of the committee were seeking cards for particular prospects, he urged them to use blank pledge cards for their friends and acquaintances, since most of such persons may not have been of the prospect list.

One-year pledges and donations are being sought for construction of an addition to the presently overcrowded school building, a recreation room for the girls and quarters for a chaplain.
