Waverly Priest Offers First Mass At St. James

Waverly — First Solemn High Mass was celebrated last Sunday by Rev. Thomas H. Watts in his home parish, St. James. Father Watts was ordained in St. Ann Church, Hornell on the previous day by His Excellency Auxiliary Bishop Casey.

He is a graduate of St. Andrew and St. Bernard seminaries in Rochester and is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Thomas J. Watts, 330 Chemung St. Waverly.

Other officers of the Mass were: Rev. G. Stuart Hogan, pastor, assistant priest; Rev. Joseph F. Hogan, chaplain at Notre Dame High School, Elmira, deacon; Rev. James E. Marvin, assistant pastor at Sacred Heart Cathedral, Rochester, subdeacon.

The Rev. Bartholomew J. O'Brien, assistant pastor of St. Peter and Paul Church, Elmira, celebrated the sermon.

In his sermon, Father O'Brien appealed first to the friends of Father Watts — "If you are truly friends of this young priest, then when you kneel before him to receive his priestly blessing, whisper to him these words of encouragement: 'Father, I promise to pray for you at least one hour every day for your priesthood.'"

Secondly, Father O'Brien appealed to the parents of Father Watts by recounting a story of the father and mother of a priest who was celebrating the silver jubilee of his priesthood. The priest's father, a venerable old gentleman, was asked to say a few words at the reception. "My son," the father said, "you mother and I now present you with our jubilee gift — a gift of twenty five years of rosaries of Our Lady which we began on the day of your ordination, and which we have continued down to today." Father O'Brien then turned to Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Watts and said: "I hope that someday you too can give your son the same beautiful jubilee gift of rosaries."

Thirdly, Father O'Brien appealed to Father Watts himself by encouraging him to follow the example of the Curé of Ars, the patron saint of parish priests, and like him to center his priesthood around the pulpit, the confessional and the altar.

A reception for friends of Father Watts in the parish hall in the afternoon was attended by nearly 300 people.
