

## Basilian Rites To Ordain 2 Rochesterians In Toronto

Two Rochester young men will be ordained to the Holy Priesthood in the Congregation of St. Basil in Toronto on Saturday, June 29 and will celebrate their First Solemn Masses in their respective parish churches, Sunday, June 30.

They are the Rev. Robert H. Hall, C.S.B., son of Mr. and Mrs. Gerard H. Hall, 34 McKinley St. and the Rev. William C. Marceau, C.S.B., son of Mr. and Mrs. Charles Marceau, 423 Electric Ave.

ORDINATION with their class will take place in St. Basil Church, Toronto with His Eminence James Cardinal McGowan conferring the Holy Orders.

Father Marceau will bring his First Solemn Mass at 11 a.m. June 30 in Sacred Heart Cathedral. His Excellency, Auxiliary Bishop Casey will preach the sermon. The Rev. Eugene Malley, C.S.B., theology professor at St. Basil's will be assistant priest; the Rev. Gerald T. Connor, deacon and the Rev. W. H. Marshall, C.S.B. of St. Thomas High School, Houston, Tex., sub-deacon.

His early schooling was at Sacred Heart grammar school and Aquinas Institute, where he was graduated in 1945. Father Marceau served in the U.S. Navy, took his profession of vows in the Rochester Basilian Novitiate and was sent to Assumption University. After receiving his B.A. degree in May, 1954 he served two years as a member of the Aquinas Institute staff teaching religion and English.

Father Marceau took his first year of theology at Le Grand Seminaire de Quebec. He later went to St. Basil Seminary, Toronto to complete his studies for the priesthood.

Reception for Father Marceau will be held from 4 to 7 p.m. on Sunday in the Aquinas Institute cafeteria, Dewey Ave.

Father Hall will celebrate his First Solemn Mass at 11 a.m. June 30 in St. John the Evangelist Church, Humboldt St. Sermon will be preached by the Rev. Alphonse Malone, C.S.B. of the St. John Fisher College faculty. The Rev. James Embser, C.S.B. will be deacon and the Rev. Leo Klum, C.S.B., sub-deacon.

Father Hall attended St. John the Evangelist Grammar School. (Continued on page 8)
