Bangalore Archbishop Congratulates Benefactor

Monsignor Arthur F. Florack's financial assistance started a new parish and built a church in the Archdiocese of Bangalore, India and will assist in erecting another new church according to Archbishop Thomas Polakowsky in a letter received this week.

THE LETTER commenting on Monsignor Florack's elevation to an Episcopal Prelate came to the Rev. George W. Wood, diocesan director of the Society for the Propagation of the Faith from the Archbishop in Bangalore.

He recalled visits here in the past, the last time in 1953 with Monsignor John S. Randall, then director of the Society and Mon-

signor Florack, pastor of St. Michael Church who has been a friend of the prelate in India for the last 17 years.

Monsignor Florack, the Archbishop said, "has always evinced the keenest, practical interest in the missionary apostolate of which he is an enthusiastic supporter and benefactor."

ST. MICHAEL CHURCH in India, built with money sent by the Rochester pastor was blessed and opened, May 24, 1954. The church, 110 feet in length by 80 feet has accommodation for 1100 persons. "Our people squat on the floor a very few pews," the letter said.

The name of Monsignor Arthur F. Florack appears on a mural tablet and the pastor and the people "remember him in their prayers and of course myself also."

A parochial school in the new parish which as a congregation of 1500 was blessed and opened on May 18, 1957.

The Catholic population of Bangalore is rapidly expanding chiefly because of the immigration of many Catholic workmen from surrounding dioceses. A church dedicated to St. Peter X will soon be erected and foundations laid within the month. Monsignor Florack has promised assistance for this parish, the Archbishop said.

THE PRELATE in India spoke of the kindness to him of Bishop Kearney, of priests in the diocese here, the Sisters of Mercy and Our Lady of Mercy High School students.

Archbishop Polakowsky recalled that he met Father Florack first in February, 1940, when the former was a priest of the Archdiocese of Madras in charge of a parish and editor of the English Catholic Weekly of Madras. He returned to India and was appointed Bishop of the newly erected Diocese of Coimbatore and conserved on June 29, 1940. He was later elevated to the Archbishopric of Bangalore.
